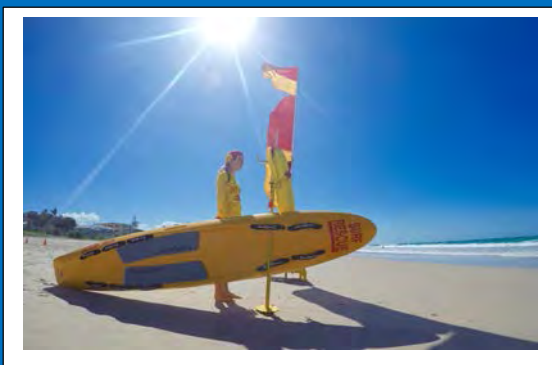

# President's Report



It's no exaggeration to describe the performance of Pacific SLSC in all facets of surf lifesaving this season as outstanding. Through a strong and dedicated Management Committee the club continues to set new benchmarks which are a credit to all involved.

Last season saw Pacific finish on a high. We received four major awards at the Point Danger Branch Annual Awards Dinner including the highly coveted Patrol Club of the Year Award. Greg Bowers was awarded the Andy Frizzell OAM OBE Award for services to junior activities, Hayley Bowers was awarded the Under 18 Lifesaver of the Year and Clayton Webster was awarded the Lifesaver of the Year. Greg, Hayley and Clayton then went on to contest their awards at the SLSQ Annual Awards Dinner. Clayton was announced as the SLSQ Lifesaver of the Year, and won a bursary of \$500 which he donated to Pacific. Clayton then represented Queensland at the SLSA Annual Awards Dinner among some highly impressive nominees. While he didn't win the national award, Clayton represented Pacific SLSC on the national stage with great humility.

At the beginning of the season ambitious goals were set including the formalisation of a five year strategic plan that focused on connecting with our members and community, sustainable growth, governance, maximum recognition of members and club achievements, and formal KPI's in most major areas. Pacific is as strong today as it's ever been and most importantly now has a proven strategy for continued success.

The members of a club are its most valuable resource, and Pacific is fortunate to have such a high calibre of membership, enthusiastic and dedicated to accomplishing club sustainability. We have seen an overall membership increase from 242 to 331 members; nippers grew from 108 to 147, as well as an increase in our active membership to 105 members. These active members completed over 6,000 hours of patrol and water safety, ensuring no lives lost on Pacific Beach.



Through great leadership from current Queensland Life Saver of the Year and Club Captain Clayton Webster, and Chief Training Officer Rachael Clark, the club continues to establish itself with the highest levels of award proficiency and beach patrol standards - our club's primary objective. These standards have seen Pacific continue our dominance of the Point Danger Branch patrol efficiency competition – an achievement recognised by the community locally and at a state level.

Pacific's financial position continues to improve. This has been achieved by the continuous generous donations, sponsorship and grants as well as sound fiscal management over the last few seasons. This has also been enhanced by the enormous amount of voluntary work done by our Supporters Club headed by Gordon Grant. As a result, the club was able to action one of our largest gear acquisitions and club improvement programs to the value of \$98,709. Major items included new bathrooms for the Supporters Club, new IRB and motor, tractor, 8 nipper boards, rescue boards, tubes and resuscitation manikins all on top of the normal day to day running of the club.



Continued development of our nippers by the Junior Activities Committee has provided a valuable impetus to numerous projects, not least of which was the support provided during our Surf Rescue Appeal, which netted \$10,000, and the Branch U8-U10 Team's carnival held at our beach. We had a Pacific Club record of six members in the Point Danger Branch Representative Team, and achieved podium finishes at all carnivals, including best ever results at State. This highlighted yet another successful season for junior activities. The increased number of young lifesavers coming from our nippers has also been crucial to the advancement of a harmonious and completely integrated club.



Our Youth Development team led by Nicole and Hayley Bowers continued to promote, retain, and grow this important area of our club. This season more members joined the Team X-Treme Program and our club sent a record number of young members to the Surf Soldiers and Breaka camps. Pacific also had our biggest contingent attend the Gold Coast Youth Ball where we were named 2015/16 Runner Up Youth Improvement Club of the Year.

Our 26 members who attended were far and away the most to represent any club and this is our second award in three years for YIPS. Our commitment to recognition also saw our members win four of the seven awards for Point Danger Branch Youth Member of the Month.

The momentum that our surf sport program has gained over the last few years has seen Pacific have its most successful competition season in over 25 years resulting in record participation at all levels, as well as medals at all major Branch, State, and National level carnivals. One of the most pleasing aspects of our surf sport program is our resurgence in the surf lifesaving events, Champion Lifesaver and Patrol Competition. Pacific, for the second year in a row, was the dominant club in the branch and had great representation at state in these events.

Success no doubt breeds success and our challenge over the next few years will be ensuring that we have the resources to not only meet but exceed the demands that come. There is no doubt that Pacific has a very

exciting future. It is my belief that the entire club membership has that willingness to succeed whilst still maintaining our core family oriented values that ensure we are a club that promotes something for everyone. We will continue to deliver on our mission of a proactive and effective surf lifesaving club leading the way in lifesaving service provision, education, sport, beach and water safety advocacy and community leadership.

It has certainly been an honour and pleasure to serve as President over and for Pacific SLSC for the 2015/2016 season.

# Treasurer's Report



I am pleased to report on yet another successful financial year at Pacific Surf Life Saving Club for the 2015-2016 season as the club goes from strength to strength conducting beach patrols, growing surf sports for both juniors and senior members and improving facilities for club members.

This season the club reported a profit of \$34,721 (2015: \$17,343) after depreciation which is up on last year. A great result whilst the club has achieved the following financial achievements that included a mix of building improvements, purchases of essential lifesaving equipment and new surf sports equipment:

- ✚ Function room bathroom renovation \$42,442
- ✚ New roller doors both gear sheds \$2,785
- ✚ Alternations and repairs to the patrol arena \$3,490
- ✚ Alternations to roadworthy IRB trailer \$1,538
- ✚ 8 fibreglass nipper boards \$7,980
- ✚ Patrol Rash Shirts distributed to all IRB Drivers & Crew \$1,750
- ✚ Up to date patrol uniforms distributed to all patrolling members \$2,000
- ✚ Desktop computer \$1,103
- ✚ Second hand tractor \$11,030
- ✚ IRB including signage \$14,316
- ✚ IRB motor \$5,200
- ✚ Double ski \$5,075

The achievements listed above would not have been possible without the receiving essential funds from the following notable contributors including grants;

Once again Pacific Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club continues to be the major contributor to the club. Without their contributions the club would not have been able to grow and accomplish the many achievements listed above. A special thank you to the Committee and their small band of committed volunteers.

In addition to the above funds, the Annual Surf Rescue Appeal raised \$10,469 this year. This was an outstanding effort given the collection occurred before the season officially commenced. Thank you to those members that took the time to make the appeal a success for Pacific SLSC.

The committee will continue to pursue grants for large equipment purchases and building improvements to provide updated facilities and essential improvements for members. I can confirm for the upcoming season the club has been successful in obtaining \$30,000 from Gambling Community Benefit Fund and \$3,012 from Rotary Club of Southport with a number of grant outcomes yet to be received.

Pacific Surf Life Saving Club and Pacific Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club continue to remain debt free which is a credit to all concerned. The current financial position has not occurred by chance, it is a result of numerous seasons where committed club members have strived to ensure grants are applied for, alternative income streams are sort, monies are spent in the right areas and operational costs are kept to a minimum. A credit to all committee members involved.

The audited financial report is enclosed for members to review.

# Club Captain's Report



Thanks once again for a great season! Pacific has successfully patrolled the beaches and made sure we looked after all beachgoers who enjoyed our beautiful part of the coast.



It has been a pleasure working with all Patrol Captains and groups this year. Our patrol inspections went well, with groups only losing two points at each inspection. The practice scenarios and training has been a positive way of keeping everyone's skills at a high level.



Some of our statistics for the season include 24 rescues resulting in ZERO drownings. We performed only 21 first aid cases including four fractures or dislocations, two major wounds, three minor wounds, three marine stings and nine other types. Throughout the season we recorded 953 preventative actions and conducted two searches for missing persons.

There was an increase in rescues this year compared to last year with most rescues occurring towards 13th Avenue, which has proven to be a hotspot. There were also several rescues towards 19th Avenue. Our extra roving patrols at the start and end of each shift have worked well.

During the season, we purchased a replacement second hand tractor and received a new IRB with motor thanks to Southport Rotary. Our updated patrol arena has given us more shelter and the extra surveillance capability with the elevated seat.

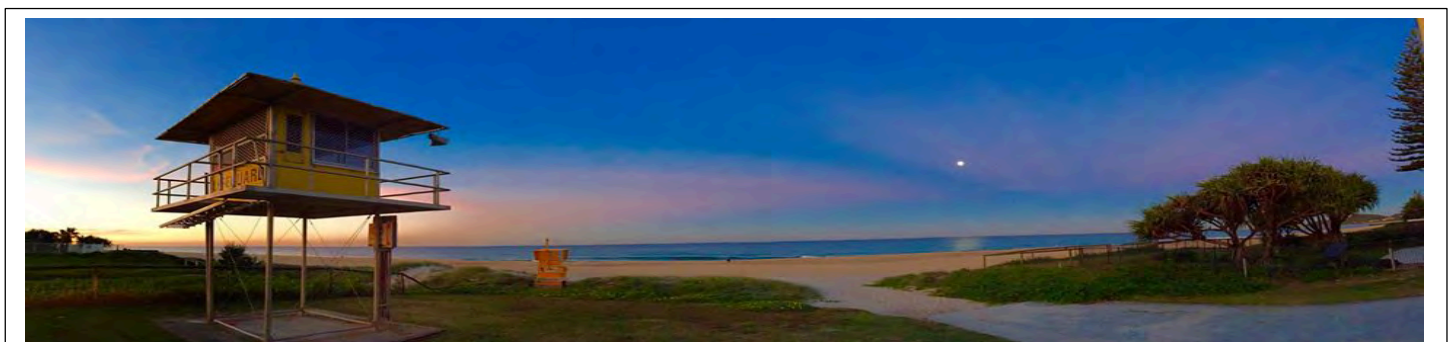

# Chief Training Officer's Report



During season 2015/16, I had the pleasure of being the club's Chief Training Officer once again. I am happy to report that members of Pacific gained nearly 50% more awards this season than that of 2014/15. The senior members of Pacific gained more than 140 awards between courses run at Pacific, those run by Point Danger Branch, its clubs or other emergency care courses (CPR, First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques and Spinal Management) run by Surf Life Saving Queensland's Academy. A full list of the senior awards gained can be found on page 12 of the Annual Report. Our junior members also completed 128 nipper age awards and over 250 preliminary and competition evaluations.



As well as gaining all of the above new awards, each of our senior members also attended one of four annual proficiency days to renew their skills.

What has surely now become one of our annual traditions, the combined Under 13 CPR and Under 14 SRC camp weekend, kicked off our training during the September school holidays. The camp saw 26 of our future lifesavers gain eleven (11) Surf Rescue Certificates to join our patrolling roster and a further fifteen (15) members gain resuscitation awareness skills awards in line with their nipper age award. A big thank you once again to the parents who ensured that everyone was well fed and looked after over the weekend.

Anthony Foliott once again led the training for a very successful Bronze Medallion course with the assessment held before Christmas giving Pacific nine (9) new Bronze Medallion holders and another Certificate II upgrade completed by a returning member.

The end of the season also saw a successful IRB Crew course run with trainers and members from Coolangatta SLSC whereby five (5) members gained new awards. Terry Place also became re-accredited as an IRB Trainer prior to the course commencing and Paul Mowbray assisted as an IRB Driver – without them, the course would not have been able to proceed.

Pacific has also been fortunate enough to expand its training gear and equipment with the addition of four new Baby Anne Manikins, thanks to the generous donation by Clayton Webster of his SLSQ Lifesaver of the Year bursary, and just recently an ART Manikin thanks to the ongoing support of Southport Rotary. These items will assist greatly in our training for next season.

Pacific continues to have one of the highest ratios of trainers (and assessors) to club members. On top of normal beach proficiencies each Trainer, Assessor and Facilitator is also required to attend TAF Proficiencies so their knowledge and skills remains current. I would like to thank all of our TAF's who completed the necessary award upgrades and personal development this season – I know how difficult it can be.

Congratulations to all members who gained new awards this past season. Enjoy your break and get ready for the training to ramp back up prior to the season starting again.

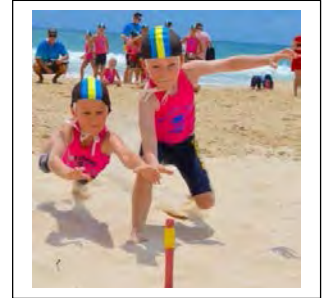
# Junior Activity Chairperson's Report

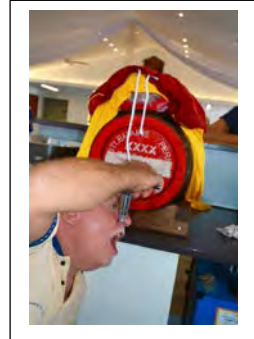
# Supporters Club Report

# Our Surf Club

Pacific Surf Life Saving Club was founded in 1947 to provide volunteer beach patrols in North Palm Beach, Gold Coast, Australia.



Up until 1930 there were no surf clubs on the Palm Beach strip. In this year the City of Brisbane Royal Life Saving Club changed its name and set up the Palm Beach Surf Life Saving Club and many of our foundation members were members of this club. When war broke out most of the surf club members went off to join the Army, Navy or Air Force. In 1945 most pre-war members came back to their clubs but times had changed. Many of our foundation members who were returned servicemen had difficulty returning to Palm Beach SLSC.

For some time the local Progress Association had been asking for a new club to be started in the North Palm Beach area. There was an increase in the number of houses and people living in this area and this represented a water safety problem. At the end of the 1946-47 season twenty members left there to start a new surf club between the Palm Beach SLSC and Tallebudgera SLSC.

Pacific SLSC was very lucky to be started with members who had experience as Captains, Chief Instructors, Secretary, Treasurer and Transport Officers. When these members decided to break away, fifteen of them decided to put in £5 each to start off the club.



Finding a name for our new surf club had its problems. From the many put forward such as 'Pacific', 'North Palm Beach' and 'Elanora' - 'Pacific' was chosen. This name reflected that most of the foundation members were returned servicemen who had served in the Pacific area. A close look at the clubs official badge will show that its design is the same as the returned serviceman's badge and the club colours were also taken from the Pacific area; brown for the sand, blue for the sea and gold for the sun.

The first official meeting of the club was held on Tuesday 26 April 1947.



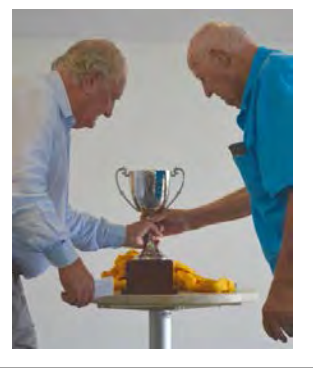
# Old Boys

The Old Boys will always be a part of our history and they have done so much for the club setting a strong path for the future. As we get new Old Boys it is important that the challenge of keeping Pacific on top is kept alive.

# Surf Sports Wrap-Up

Season 2015/16 has been without doubt the most successful surf sports season since the glamour years of the late 80's. The Pacific cap was very prominent at all carnivals and was worn very passionately by every competitor in Team Pacific.



This season Pacific was fortunate enough to have no less than six Level One Coaches devote countless voluntary hours in all disciplines, which resulted in record participation not only at carnivals but in every training session. This has seen Pacific not only continue its dominance in beach events but slowly but surely start to see results in the water at a state and national level.

Our success included a national medal - a bronze in the 45-49 Single Surf Ski by Rob Pade, our first in over 25 years - 5 national finals, 16 state medals including State Endurance events, 22 state finals and countless medals at a branch level in nippers, as well as a club record six members making the Point Danger Branch Representative Team. Another highlight was Cameron Lang, finally cracking the gold in the flags event at the Queensland Youth Surf Life Saving Championships after winning silver for the last two seasons – Pacific's first individual state nipper Gold medal in recent times.

Over the last few years the nippers have been leading the way in surf sports and again have posted great results including a Top 6 finish at the Gold Coast City Titles. However, the resurgence of our masters and open competitors was also definitely a highlight at both the State and Aussie Titles. These members achieved some fantastic results including five state medals to go with our Aussie medal. Their results are undoubtedly an inspiration for our up and coming younger competitors.

Pacific led the way this season in the Surf Rescue events of Champion Lifesaver and Patrol Competition, resulting in our club being named Branch Champions for the second year in a row, and also achieving great results at state level.

This season Pacific was fortunate enough to be able to host a carnival for the second year in a row. PDB's U8-U10 Team's carnival saw over 300 competitors hitting on our beach.

In January, over the Australia Day weekend, the club hosted for the first time, a combined Club Championships with both nippers and the senior club. The day was very successful in bringing the whole club together. The event saw the biggest participation at a club champs since the late 80's and is a true testament to the club's improvement and participation in surf sports.

Planning for next season has already started including the commencement of an experienced coach to build on our results and enhance the skills of our volunteer coaches.

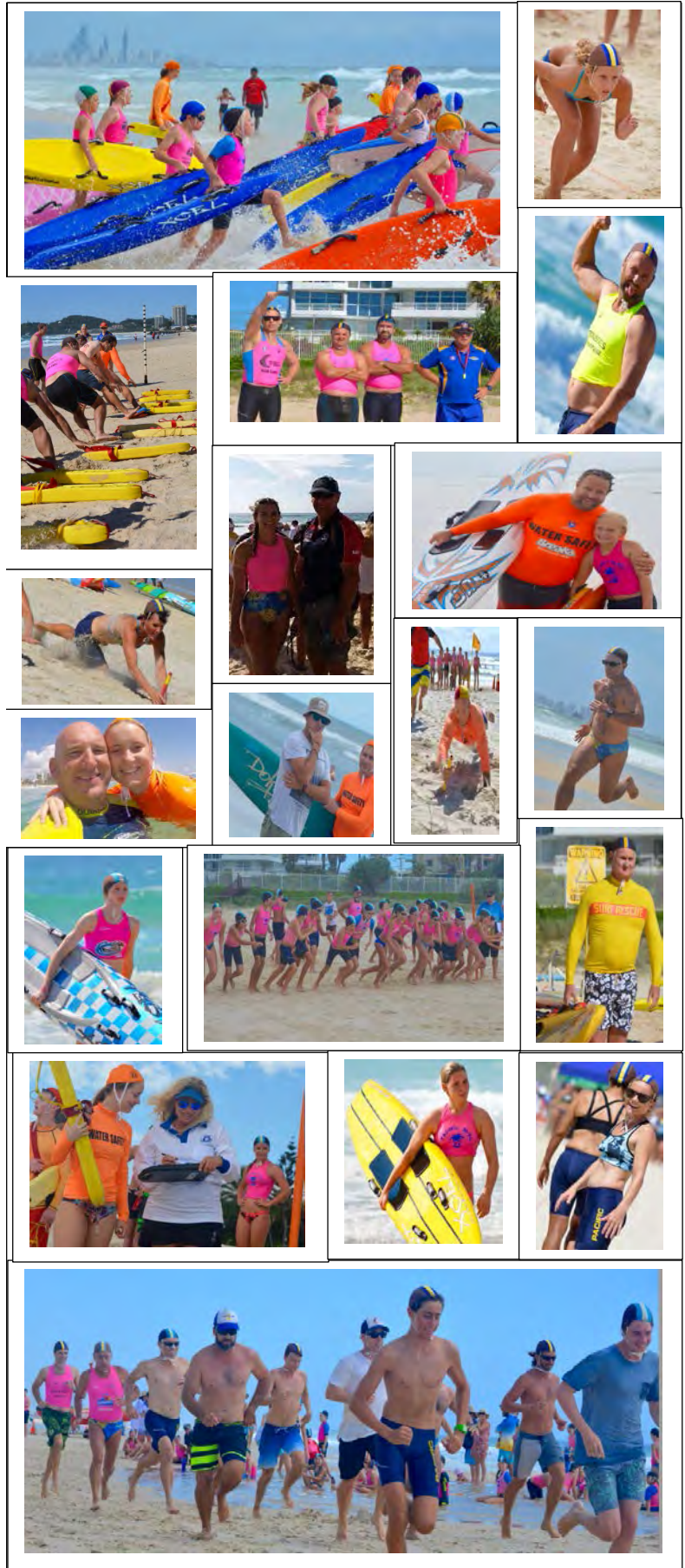

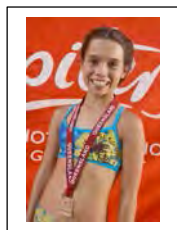

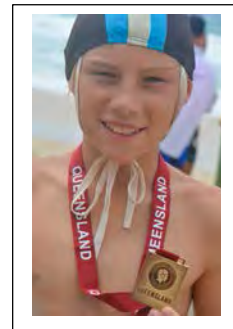

**Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (Queensland)* and the entity's Constitution. The board of management has determined that the entity is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

**a. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

**b. Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

**c. Cash on Hand**

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

**d. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

**e. Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

**f. Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

**g. Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the entity during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a currently liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

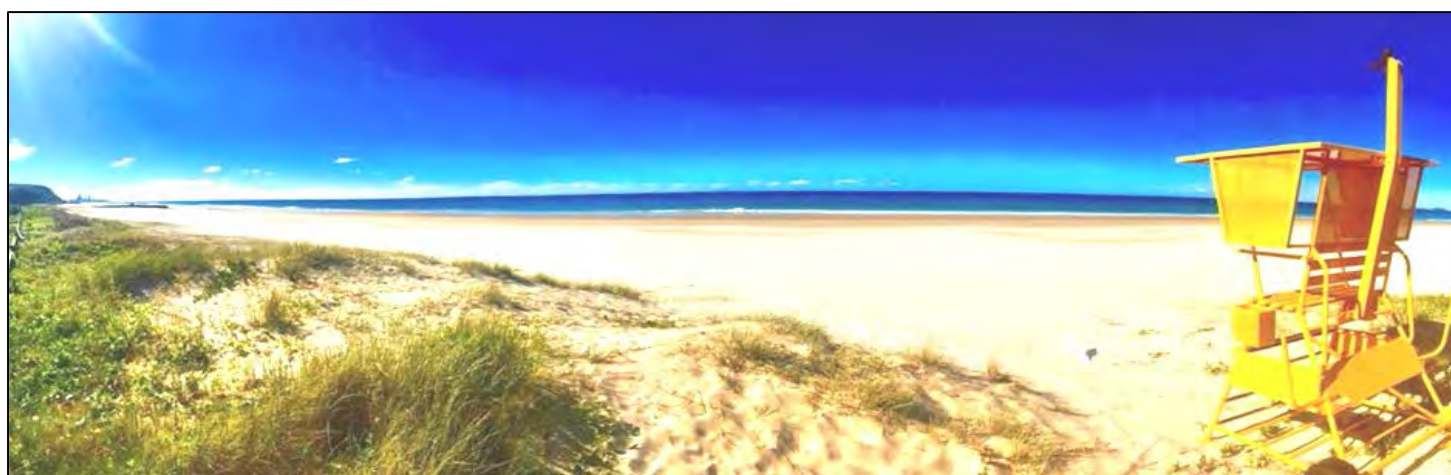
