PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Season 2016/17 marked Pacific's 70th season, and can only be described as one of the most outstanding in our proud history. Again through a strong and dedicated management team, the club continues to set new benchmarks whilst still maintaining our family oriented values and culture.

During the off season we received five (5) major awards at the Point Danger Branch Annual Awards, including the highly coveted Club of the Year, Youth Development Club of the Year, U18 Junior Lifesaver of the Year (Ashley Pade), Rookie Coach of the Year (Greg Bowers) and the Silver Clive Hammond Medal. These awards were then all contested at State where we were awarded Queensland Club of the Year and Youth Development Club of the Year, as well as the Gold Clive Hammond Medal. Rachael Clark was also awarded the Prof Tess Crammond Medal for Outstanding Resuscitation— an award reflecting our core objectives.

Pacific then went on to represent Queensland at the SLSA Annual Gala Awards and Dinner in Sydney where we achieved what I believed is the club's finest achievement — DHL Australian Surf Life Saving Club of the Year — a recognition that each and every member can be so proud of.



As with last season our Management team again set out their goals based on the club's five (5) year Strategic Plan, focussing on connecting with our members and community, sustainable growth, governance, maximising the recognition of our club and members' achievements to continue to deliver great outcomes in all facets of surf lifesaving.

It goes without saying that the members are and always will be the most valuable resource of any club and at Pacific it's no secret that our members are very dedicated to achieving our goals, including the main reason we exist – ensuring no lives are lost on Pacific Beach. This season our patrol members increased from 104 to 114 and completed 6596 Hours of patrol. Overall membership saw a slight increase from 331 to 332 in line with our strategic plan and KPI's.

Through great leadership by our Club Captain, Shaun Slattery, and Chief Training Officer, Rachael Clark, our club continues to set high standards with beach patrols and the level of skill needed to maintain proficiency. This season we completed 32 rescues and saw awards increase by 81.5 %.

Pacific's financial position is very healthy and is attributed to not only record amounts of donations and sponsorship, but the ongoing strong fiscal management of the club and its resources. We are again fortunate to have a dedicated team led by Gordon Grant in our Supporters Club that generates a significant amount of revenue. This is on top of an active Finance Committee that has been able to generate successful grants and sponsorship for vital equipment and club renovations, including rescue boards, ART manikin, gear trailer, tents, IRB Helmets and nipper equipment.

Being in a strong financial position has allowed the club to engage a paid Surf Coach and also an Office Manager for the first time in our history. These two key positions have enhanced our day-to-day operations resulting in not only better results, but stronger governance practices, as well as the introduction of key measurement indicators.



Continued development of our nippers by a strong Junior Committee led by Gavin Jordan — the Club's first Nipper to become Junior Activities Chairperson — has provided valuable impetus in creating an environment that has increased the number of young lifesavers coming from this valuable nursery. With the appointment of Richard Hancock as Coach, Pacific's increased results in surf sports for our juniors was evident particularly in the water events which in previous seasons were greatly overshadowed by our beach results.

Youth Development is a vital cog in the Club's on going sustainability and success, and being named SLSQ Youth Development Club of the Year last season, it's no secret that we have developed the right formulas to promote, retain and grow in this area. This season we again sent young members to Surf Soldiers and Breaka Leadership Camps as well as having five (5) members in the successful PDB Team X-Treme program. Pacific again took a large contingent to the 2016 Gold Coast Youth Ball where we had four (4) members complete their YIPs Gold Award. Our commitment to recognition also saw two (2) of our members, Hayley Bowers and Taylah Slattery, being awarded the Point Danger Branch Youth of the Month during the season.

Our results in surf sports go from strength to strength. Again, Pacific continues to bat above its weight at most carnivals, as well as record participation at all levels including Branch, State and National Championships. Highlights included our successful Masters results, nippers and being Branch champions at the Surf Rescue Champs for the third year running. The highlight of the year was the reintroduction of our first Senior March Past Team in 25 years. Lead by a passionate Michelle Slattery, we had an all ladies team at the State Titles followed by a few gents joining the team at the Aussies — flying our flag proudly.

A defining moment for Pacific this season came in the last two (2) weeks of the season when we had the introduction of our Seahorse Program for children with special needs, that was championed by Michelle and Taylah Slattery. The implementation of this program is a clear indicator of our Club's commitment to connecting with our community.

Thank you also to our Club Photographers, Troy Fenech and Brendon Butler, for their hard work during the season capturing our activities. Thanks also to all members who submitted photos or content for this report.

As I mentioned at the end of last season, success breeds success and our challenge over the coming seasons will be to ensure that we have the resources and foresight to exceed member and community expectations. There is no doubt Pacific will continue to have a very exciting future.

As President I am very confident that we have a dedicated and passionate membership that has a willingness to succeed whilst still maintaining our core family values and culture which ensures we are a club that promotes something for everyone.

We will continue to deliver on our mission of a proactive and effective surf lifesaving club leading the way in providing lifesaving service, education, sport, beach and water safety advocacy and community leadership.

It has certainly been an honour and pleasure to serve as President for Pacific SLSC during the 2016/2017 season.

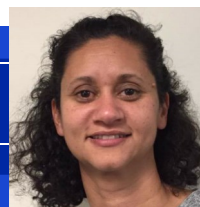

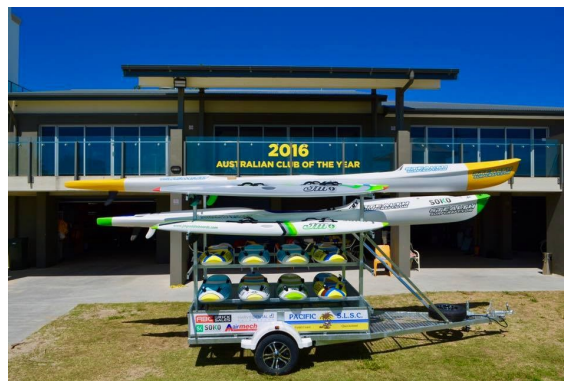
TREASURER'S REPORT



I am pleased to report on yet another successful financial year at Pacific Surf Life Saving Club for the 2016/2017 season as the club goes from strength to strength conducting beach patrols, growing surf sports for both juniors and senior members as well as improving facilities for club members.

This season the club reported a profit of \$22,877.18 after depreciation, to add to the financial achievements that included a mix of building improvements, purchases of essential lifesaving equipment, new surf sports equipment and staff:

- ◆ New Trailer
- ◆ 10 New Tubes
- ◆ New Soft Pack First Aid And Oxygen Kit
- ◆ IRB Helmets
- ◆ 2 training Defibs
- ◆ Air Conditioning to the Training Room and Office
- ◆ Surf Sports Coach (We will call him Richard)
- ◆ Office Manager (Thanks Gabby)



The achievements listed above would not have been possible without the receiving essential funds from the following notable contributors including grants:



- ◆ Pacific Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club of \$57,000
- ◆ Department of Community Safety of \$21,640
- ◆ Community Gambling Benefit Fund of \$27,272
- ◆ SLSA – Beach Safety Equipment Fund of \$5,500
- ◆ SLSQ (Club of the Year – Bursary) of \$800
- ◆ City of Gold Coast Community Grants Program Donation of \$2,900
- ◆ City of Gold Coast of \$23,089
- ◆ Rotary Club of Southport of \$3,011.89
- ◆ SLSQ – Volunteer Dividend of \$5,500
- ◆ Palm Beach Lady Lioness of \$500

Once again Pacific Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club continues to be the major contributor to the club. Without their contributions the club would not have been able to grow and accomplish the many achievements listed above. A special thank you to the Committee and their small band of committed volunteers.

In addition to the above funds, the Annual Surf Rescue Appeal raised \$1,330 this year. A great effort was made by our own Surf Girl, Ashleigh Haines, who raised a total of \$27,083.99. This was a combination of canteen sales and fundraising efforts. A big thanks to Ashleigh and her tireless helpers.

Pacific Surf Life Saving Club and Pacific Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club continue to remain debt free which is a credit to all concerned. The current financial position has not occurred by chance, it is a result of numerous seasons where committed club members have strived to ensure grants are applied for, alternative income streams are sought, monies are spent in the right areas and operational costs are kept to a minimum. A credit to all committee members involved.

We had a busy Christmas holiday period on Pacific Beach. There were some dangerous beach conditions with big rips towards the northern groyne and south towards 13th Avenue. Our members were on top of it with roving patrols in those areas to prevent any drownings.

Our statistics for the season are 32 rescues and 1,527 preventative actions (resulting in zero drownings) and 83 first aid treatments.

Senior Club Champs was a great, fun day for our members with lots of club spirit and shenanigans. The day's results can be found on page 24.

During the season we had three patrol inspections. Two of our patrol groups received 100% and the third group received 98% - well done to all involved for these great results.

To the new members who achieved their Bronze Medallion or SRC this season, welcome to the family and thank you for your commitment. I hope and trust you have been welcomed into the Pacific family and have enjoyed your first season.

I would also like to thank all of our members from nippers, parents, trainers, coaches and committee members to the life members, see you all on the beach next season.

CHIEF TRAINING OFFICER'S REPORT



During season 2016/17, I had the pleasure of being the club's Chief Training Officer once again. I am very happy to report that this season we had an increase of 81.48% (on season 2015/16) across the twelve main patrolling awards. This was the second highest growth across Point Danger Branch. The senior members of Pacific gained more than 200 awards (a full list of the senior awards gained can be found on page 14 of the Annual Report) and our junior members also completed 110 nipper age awards and over 215 preliminary and competition evaluations.



As well as gaining all of the abovementioned new awards, each of our senior members also attended one of four (4) annual proficiency days to renew their skills.



This season's training began with the introduction of a five day intensive Bronze camp for our SRC holders to gain their Bronze Medallion. The course was trained by Tonya Pade during the first week of the September school holidays and saw the first seven (7) of our new Bronzies awarded.



The Bronze camp overlapped our annual Under 14 SRC camp weekend which ran during the middle weekend of the September school holidays. This was by far the biggest camp held in recent years and saw 18 of our future lifesavers including one parent gain their Surf Rescue Certificates to join our patrolling roster. A big thank you once again to the parents who ensured that everyone was well fed and looked after over the weekend.



Anthony Foliott once again led the training for a very successful Bronze Medallion course with the main assessment held before Christmas giving Pacific eleven (11) new Bronze Medallion holders, a Certificate II upgrade completed by a returning member and two (2) SRC holders. The second assessment in January added a further two (2) Bronze Medallion holders.

Prior to Christmas, Terry Place also trained an IRB course which saw us gain two (2) new crewies and one (1) IRB Driver upgraded. This season also saw three (3) ART Upgrade sessions, a First Aid course and an ATV and Tractor Inductions held at Pacific.

Pacific has also been fortunate enough to expand its training gear and equipment with the addition of "Artemis" our new ART Manikin and a number of donated adult, child and infant manikins and a number of training defibrillators. These items will assist greatly in our training (and especially Skills Maintenance days) for next season.

On top of normal beach proficiencies each Trainer, Assessor and Facilitator is also required to attend TAF Proficiencies so their knowledge and skills remain current. I would like to thank all of our TAF's who completed the necessary award upgrades and personal development this season – I know how difficult it can be.

Congratulations to all members who gained new awards this past season and thank you once again to our Trainers, Assessor, Water Safety members and support personnel who assisted with each and every course held this season.

SURF SPORTS OFFICER'S REPORT



2016/17 has been yet another successful surf sports season for Pacific following on from last year's great results as we again continue to bat well above our weight.

This season saw the appointment of Pacific's first paid Level 2 Surf Sports Coach, Richard Hancock, who along with our seven (7) volunteer Level 1 Coaches devoted countless hours in most disciplines that again saw record participation at both carnivals and training sessions. Richards's appointment has had immediate results in the first season, with our water results the best the club has seen in over 30 years.

Our success included 10 national finals, 21 state medals including the endurance events, as well as countless medals at branch and other carnivals. Of special mention was Cameron Lang, who gained his 4th state medal in as many years at the Junior State at Hervey Bay. Pacific again had representation in the Point Danger Branch Representative Team with four (4) of our juniors— Cameron Lang, Starr Scott, Zoey Plater, and Tiarna Bembrick— helping the team to a win in the Handicap Point Score and third overall in the state. This season, Pacific lead the way in the surf rescue events of Champion Lifesaver and Patrol Competition – resulting again in our club being Branch Champions for the 3rd year in a row and having a record ten (10) competitors qualify for the State Titles at Alexandra Headland.



Hosting a carnival was only a dream for Pacific up until the last few seasons, and again this season we were able to host both the Under 8-10 Teams Carnival and the PDB Surf Rescue Championships, a true sign of our ability to come together as a team and put in the hard work required.

It's well documented that Pacific Nippers have led the way in surf sports for the club over the last five years, along with the resurgence of our master in the last two. However we are now starting to see some participation and results in our U17 and Open competitors - a good guide that our surf sports and retention strategic plans are starting to come to fruition.

The Senior and Junior Club Championships were again a highlight of our calendar season, and participation continues to grow in all categories which is a direct result of our surf sports strategies.

The highlight of the year was no doubt our first senior march past team at a State Titles in almost thirty (30) years. I was honoured to coach both an all female team, who marched and represented our proud club with pride at North Kirra, and the team with the aid of a few gents for the Aussies at Coolangatta.

Planning of next season is again already under way, with the reappointment of our Coach Richard, as well as the logistics of sending both Junior and Senior State teams to the Sunshine Coast and a team to the Aussies in Western Australia.

It has certainly been a pleasure being the club's first Surf Sports Officer sitting on the club Board of Management and I would like to personally thank all those that have competed and represented our proud club over the season.

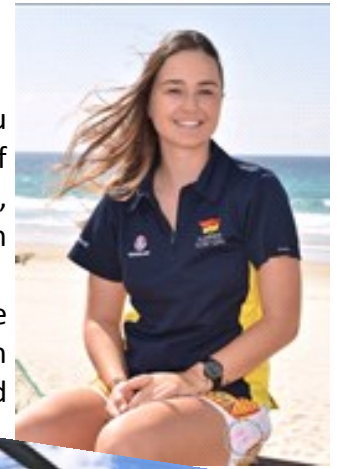

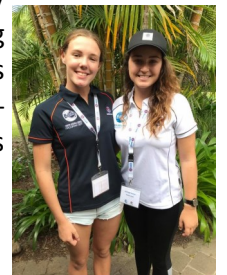


YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

This season 17 new members joined the 14-25 year old age group. They completed their SRC's in September, have been putting many, many hours into patrol and have been cleaning up in the competition field as well.



One of the greatest things about the Gold Coast Youth Development program is the camps. These various camps are highly beneficial to this age group. This season we had ten (10) youth represent Pacific at the Gold Coast Youth Development Camp as participants, leaders and mentors. For three days, the 14-17 years olds spent the entire time interacting, bonding and learning from their peers in very close proximity. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2017

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (Queensland)* and the entity's Constitution. The board of management has determined that the entity is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

b. **Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

c. **Cash on Hand**

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

d. **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

e. **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

f. **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

g. Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the entity during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a currently liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
