2018/19 marks the 72nd Season Pacific SLSC has been patrolling North Palm Beach and I am pleased to say that we have continued our mission of no lives lost between the flags, continued growth and maintaining the club's family-oriented values and culture.

As always our membership recognition is a vital part of our strategic plan and values. During the off season, Pacific was again very successful securing 7 awards at the Point Danger Branch Awards including, U14 Life Saver of the Year - Milly Beikoff Smart, Andy Frizelle Commitment to Junior Activities - Michelle Slattery, Trainer of the Year - Rachael Clark, Earl Smith Junior Award - Jessica Slattery, Clive Hammond Silver Medal - Jared Clark, Youth Development Club of the Year and Patrol Club of the Year. We attended the State Awards where for the 6th year in a row we picked up two major awards - Milly Beikoff Smart - U14 Life Saver of the Year and Rachael Clark - Trainer of the Year. Those that were there will remember Millys' amazing speech that wowed the audience. Rachael then went on to represent Pacific at the National Awards in Sydney and although she didn't win, she flew the Pacific colours with great pride. We can all be very proud of her achievement, commitment to training and the club. Late in the season Greg Bowers and Paul Mowbray received the McPherson Award for their dedication and commitment to the community.

Our management team is one that continues to deliver results based on the club's five-year strategic plan. The team focuses on connecting with our members and community, sustainable growth, governance, and maximising the recognition of our club and member achievements, to deliver valuable outcomes in all facets of Surf Life Saving.

Membership of a club will always be the most valuable resource, and again this season we have recorded growth in most areas with total membership now at 373 from 363 last season and Nippers at 146 up from 142. Importantly since 2015 we have had an amazing increase of 152% on total membership from 245 to 373.

Through the fantastic leadership of our Club Captain Shaun Slattery in his third season in this position and Chief Training Officer Anthony Foliott, the club continues to set the high standards for beach patrols, skills maintenance and training that are highly regarded throughout the surf lifesaving fraternity. This season we completed 5776 hours of patrol, an additional 424 Operational Support hours, 8 rescues, 47 prevented actions and 97 patrol awards.

Pacific's financial position continues to be solid and this is attributed to our partners through sponsorship and donations as well as members rolling up their sleeves for various fundraising activities. This season the club through donations and grants secured significant funds and invested close to \$70,000 back into rescue equipment, building renovations and equipment for the training room. The Pacific Board and its members are extremely grateful to all levels of Government and individuals that have contributed in some way.

Our Nipper program led by Gavin Jordan, continues to provide a valuable impetus in creating an environment that

increases the number of young lifesavers coming through this valuable program. With record numbers, we had another successful year in Nipper surf sports at all levels, training and development and as mentioned earlier Milly Biekoff Smart being awarded Branch and State U14 Lifesaver of the Year, a testament to her, the program and training at Pacific.

Youth development continues to be part of Pacific's DNA and our ongoing success. After being named Youth Development Club for the Branch for the third time in four years, we again sent members to the Surf Soldiers Camp as well as the Breaka State Camp. We had a number of our youth attend the Gold Coast Youth Ball, as well as conduct patrols and compete for the club. A big thank you to Chloe Schofield for taking on this challenging roll this season.

Our results in surf sports continue to go from strength to strength. Thanks to our Surf Sports Officer Michelle Slattery and Club Coach Richard Hancock whose efforts in guiding the members has seen the club again produced results above its weight. The club competed and received medals at all levels - Branch, State and National as well as hosting the U8-10 Team Carnival for the third season and the Branch Lifesaving Championships. The highlight without doubt was Paul Hyde's amazing effort at the Aussie Masters picking up a silver medal in the beach flags.

Sadly we had the passing of Norman Dunstan "Normie" at the end of the season. A member and friend who contributed so much and was an integral part of Pacific for decades. The hundreds of comments that came in is a true testament to his kind and gentle nature. Normie will be sadly missed especially at function time which he always attended.

To our Officer Manager Gabrielle Kineally and Kerrie Barnes and her team at Point Danger Branch, a big thank you for their continued support and guidance throughout the season. It is certainly appreciated and vital to Pacific's continued success.

As I mention at the end of every season –our challenge as a club is to keep on delivering and ensure that we have the resources and foresight to keep on exceeding member and community expectations. Pacific no doubt has a very exciting future.

As President I am very confident that we have a great Board and membership that has a willingness to maintain our growth and success whilst still maintaining our family values, culture and a club that promotes something for everyone.

It's again been an honour and pleasure to serve as President for Pacific for my fourth year through the 2018/19 Season.

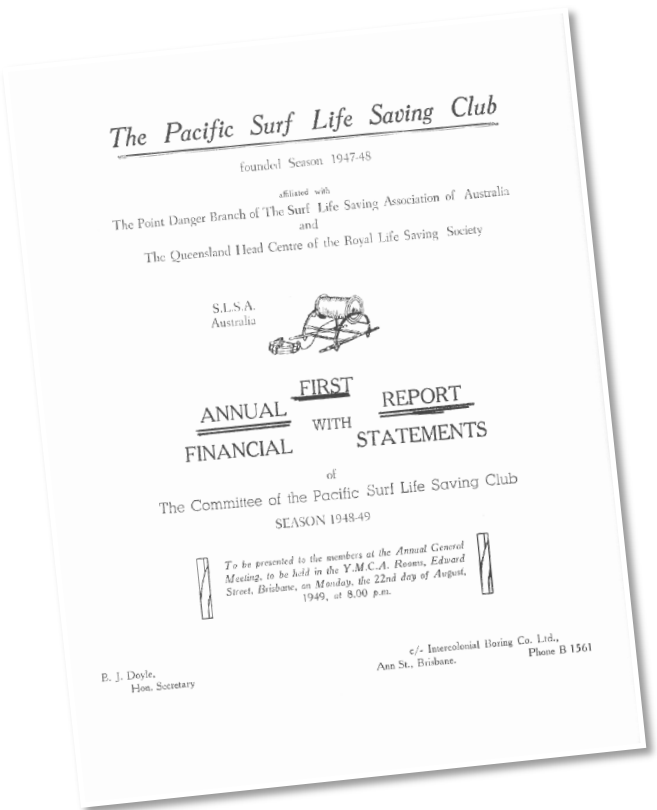

For the 2018-2019 season Pacific SLSC reports an operating loss of \$8,065 before depreciation expenses of \$58,520, resulting in a net loss of \$66,585 (2018: (\$49,180)). Council and State funding remained consistent, however donations, sponsorship and grants were down when compared to prior seasons. The club relies heavily on donations from Pacific Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club. Due to a commercial venture that fell through after considerable negotiations, donations reduced to \$14,679 (2018:\$18,905) for the year. The reduction in sponsorship and grants is an issue effecting all not-for-profits as corporate Australia looks for cost savings through reducing sponsorship and grant funding.

The club achieved the following that included a mix of building improvements, purchases of essential lifesaving equipment and training equipment;

Suggestions for other grants items are welcome for consideration.

It's been another fantastic year put in by all our members both new and old. I would like to take this opportunity to thank each and everyone of our members for their donation of valuable time and effort once again ensuring that there were no drownings between the flags in the 2018-19 season.

It's due to this diligence and dedication that we continue to provide voluntary patrols on our beach each year between September and May. I would like to also give thanks to the families who support us all coming down and patrolling our beach to keep it safe—without this family support some of us would not be here to patrol.

An awesome result was achieved by our members last season with Pacific winning the Point Danger Branch Patrol Competition Award.

The total patrol hours by our members on our beach this season was 5,775.99. Many of our members also contribute hours on Operations Support activities which includes the Westpac Helicopter, Wave Runner Jet Skis, Surfcom and Duty Officers. These members performed an additional combined 424.42 hours—well done to all our fantastic members.

Once again our statistics for this season are very impressive and it is reassuring to see that our actual rescues remain low. This is important in reducing risk to the public and our members and shows that we are vigilant performing our patrols.

I have again enjoyed the role of club captain and special thanks to the 11 Patrol Captains across our 9 Patrol Groups, the Management Committee, the Administration Team and you our patrolling members who have supported me in this role, I look forward to the 2019-20 season and hope to see you all on the beach next year.

Season 2018/19 saw a changing of the guard for Chief Training Officer (CTO) at Pacific. I had the pleasure and pressure of taking over from Rachael Clark and inherited a legacy of success. Rachael received the 2018 SLSQ Trainer of the Year and Point Danger Branch Trainer of the Year, which were a testament to her drive, passion and skill from which Pacific and its members all benefit. Congratulations Rachael, very well deserved!

The training kicked off this season with an SRC Camp followed closely by an intensive Bronze Camp during the September school holidays. It was great to see the teamwork and camaraderie that develops during these camps as well as the skills and knowledge to achieve their rescue qualifications. A Bronze / SRC course was held from October to December and various emergency care courses and short courses run by the club, branch and SLSQ were attended by members throughout the season. In total, 177 senior awards were achieved by Pacific members so far this season. At the time of printing a large group of members are attending an IRB Crew and Driver's course and preparation is underway for a Winter Bronze squad.

I'd like to thank all the trainers that helped out this season: Jeff, Andrew, Denis, Tonya, Rachael, Ken, Kev and in particular Anne Turner, whose help was invaluable and her recently acquired training skills excellent. I also would like to thank the water safety, without whom we can't get in the water: Jess, Michelle, Shaun, Taylah, Jacqui, Helen, Troy, Hamish, Paul and a few others that were always willing to help out at short notice. It was a great team effort from all at the club.

Congratulations to three members who received Training Service Certificates recognising dedication to improving the skills of others: Ken Clark – 35 years; Tonya Pade – 25 years; Jeff Deegan – 20 years.

Proficiencies (skills maintenance) were held monthly throughout the first half of the season. We had some challenges from dangerous conditions that caused some re-scheduling and split skills maintenance sessions. Thank you to those that persisted through this... Mother Nature always likes to let us know who's boss!

Thanks to the awesome efforts of Rebecca Farley, we received a grant this season to upgrade our training equipment and facilities. This includes manikin upgrade kits to enable our manikins to connect to electronic devices for improved practice accuracy, a spine-board, so we can have a dedicated one for training, new furniture for the training room, a laptop with accessories and an iPad for connection of the manikins to enable training games and exercises that will improve the quality of our CPR. This equipment will be assembled over Winter and ready for use in the coming season.

On behalf of the Pacific Management Team I'd like to offer congratulations to all members who gained new awards this past season and encourage everyone to challenge themselves and strive for the next level of excellence. Thank you once again to our trainers, assessors, water safety members and support personnel who assisted with each and every course held this season. I encourage any members who would like to join the Pacific training team to get involved and feel the satisfaction of sharing your skills and experience with others.

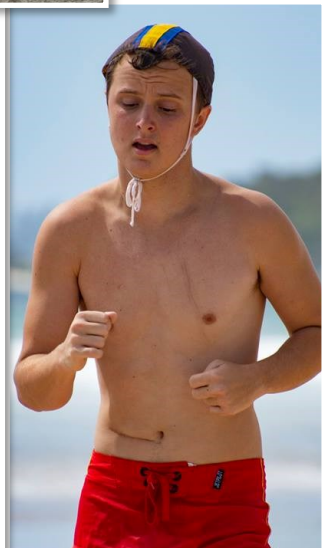

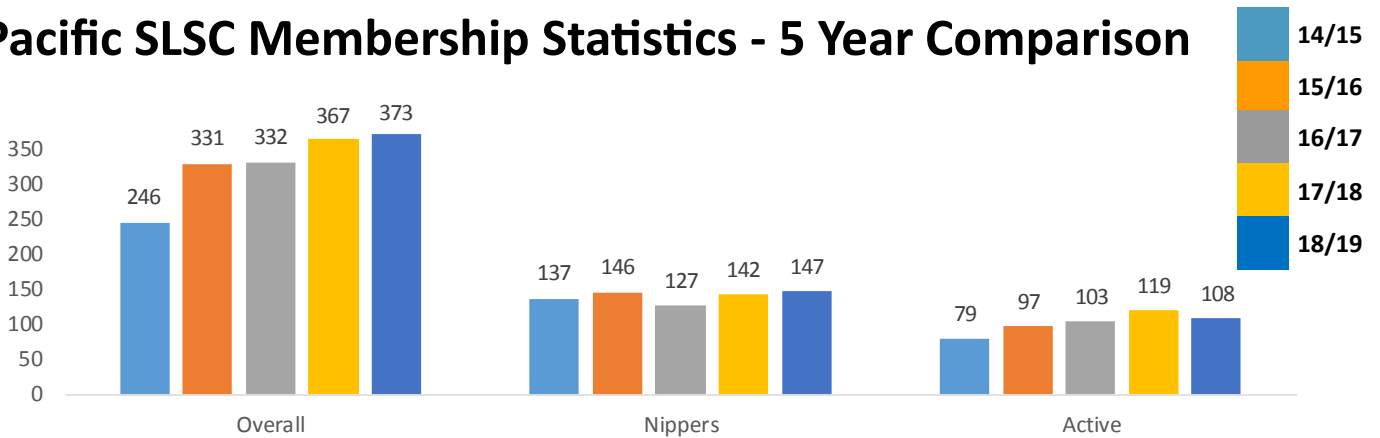

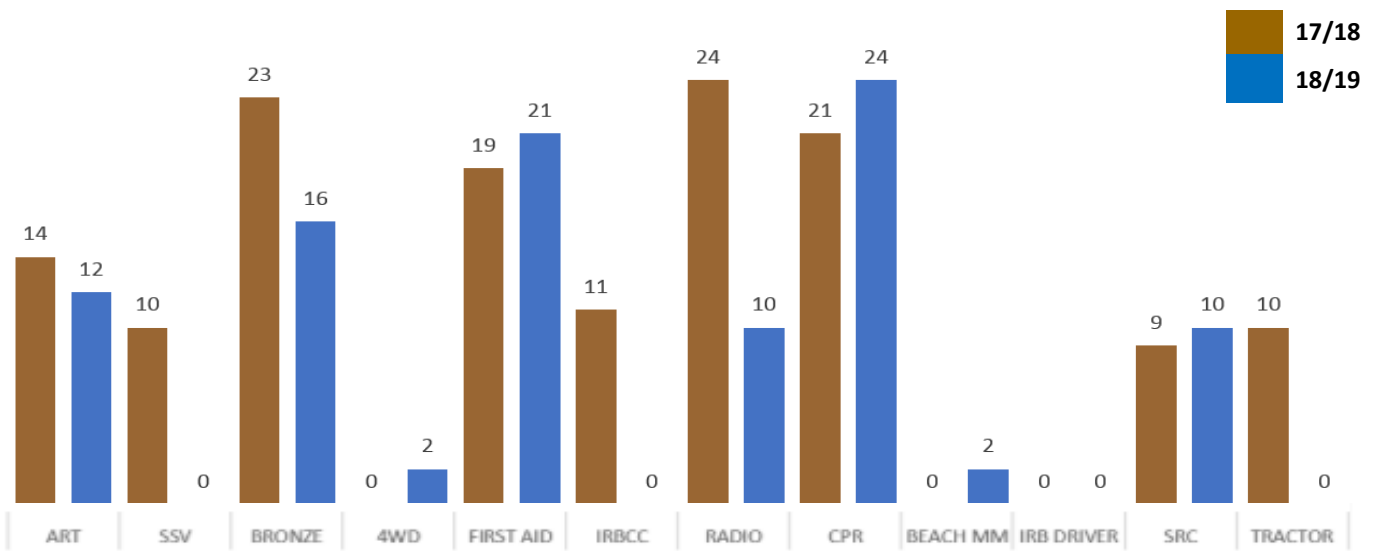
Due to work and travel commitments I am now stepping down from the committee. I know the future of Pacific Supporters is bright and I wish the incoming committee all the very best for the season ahead.

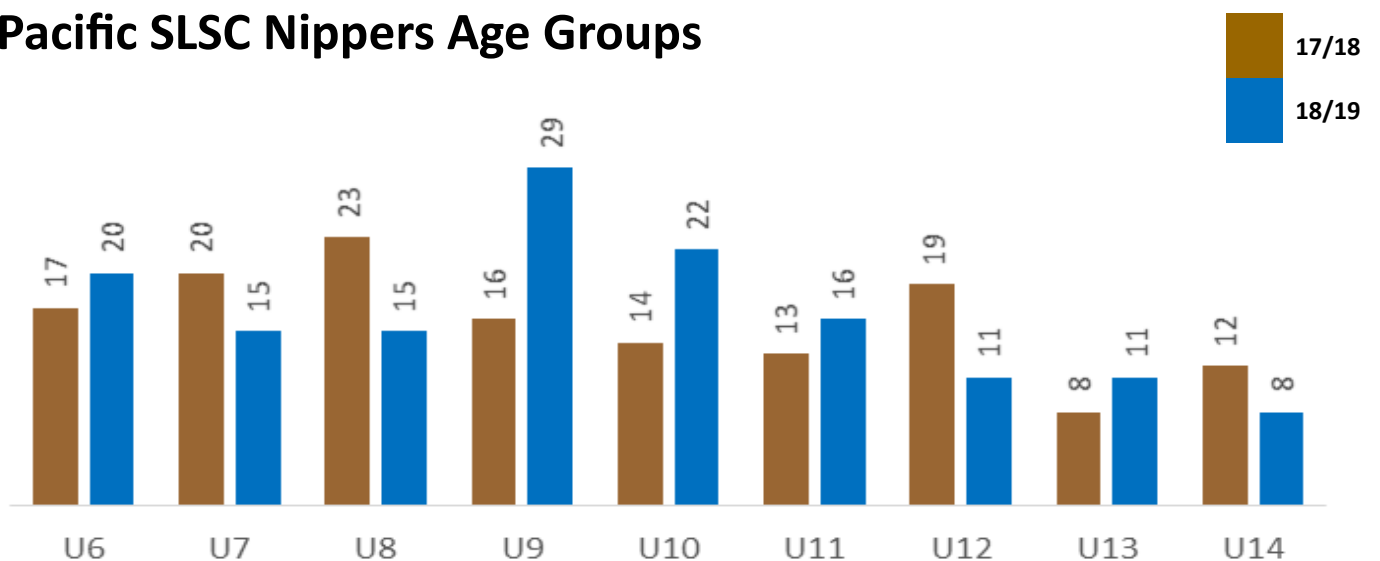
Pacific SLSC Membership Statistics - 5 Year Comparison

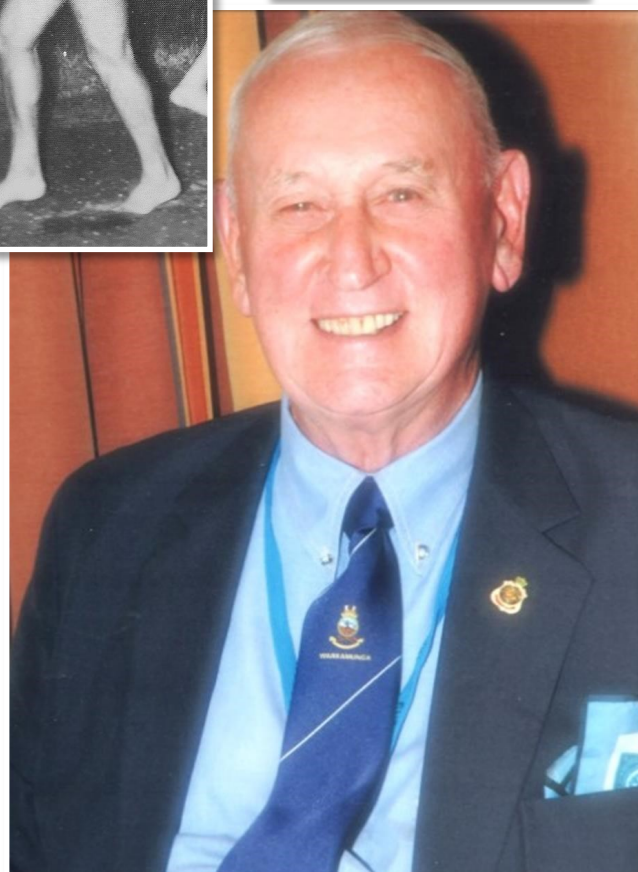
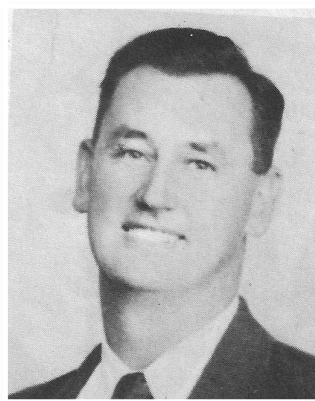
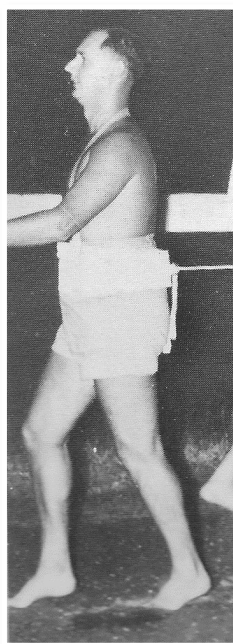

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (Queensland)* and the entity's Constitution. The board of management has determined that the entity is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

b. **Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is

c. **Cash on Hand**

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

d. **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

e. **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

f. **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

g. **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the entity during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a currently liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the





INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF PACIFIC SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INC

We have audited the financial report of Pacific Surf Life Saving Club Inc, which comprises the assets and liabilities statement as at 30 April 2019, the income and expenditure statement for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the certification by members of the committee on the annual statements giving a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the association.
