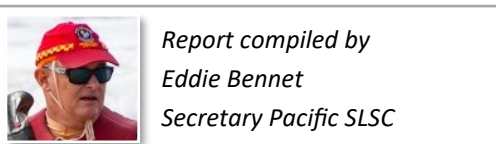
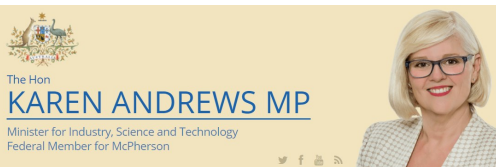

However, I am pleased to say that we have continued our mission of no lives between the flags, continued growth, whilst maintaining the club's family-oriented values and culture.

It was also a season where we sadly seen the passing of a couple much loved and valued Members. Renne Riddell who has been a stalwart on the nipper committee over many years, and our beloved Patron and Life Member Mal McNeilly MBE who's contribution to not only our club, but surf lifesaving and the community, is immeasurable.

Pacific's proud record of Member recognition continued with Anne Turner, Rebecca Farley and Jillian Jordan all receiving the McPherson award for their dedication and commitment to the community, and Rachael Clark being recognised at the annual Women in Surf event.

I am so proud of our management team that continues to deliver on the goals that are based on the club's five-year strategic plan, focusing on connecting with our members and community, sustainable growth, governance, and maximising the recognition of our club and member achievements, to deliver good outcomes in all facets of Surf lifesaving. Even in trying times during the Covid-19 fall out we managed to run the club using modern technology, meeting weekly to steer our club to the end of the season, whilst managing resources, and fulfilling our governance and club priorities.

Through the fantastic leadership of our club Captain Shaun Slattery in his 4th season in this roll and Chief Training Officer Anthony Foliott, the club continues to set the high standards with beach patrols and the level of skill need to maintain proficiency, that is highly regarded throughout the surf lifesaving fraternity. This season we completed 4715 hours of patrol, an additional 332 Operational support hours, 3 rescues ,43 prevented actions and 116 Patrol Awards.

Pacific financial position continues to be solid and is attributed to not only good fiscal management led by our treasurer Rebecca Farley, but also our partners through sponsorship and donations as well as members rolling up their sleeves for various fundraising and sourcing of grants. This season the club through the donations and grants secured \$117909 that was invested back into various rescue equipment, building renovations, and equipment for the training room. The Pacific Board and its members are extremely grateful to our Federal and State Members of Parliament and Local Government, Hon Karen Andrews MP, Michael Hart MP and City of Gold Coast Division 13 Councillor Daphne McDonald as well as the businesses and individuals that have contributed in some way.

Our nipper programme led by Gavin Jordan for the 4th season continues to provide a valuable impetus in creating an environment that continues to increase the number of young life savers coming through this valuable programme. Gavin is handing the baton over for next season and he can be very proud of the job that he and his team have done over the 4 years, that is recognised at a branch and state level. With strong numbers we had another successful year in nipper surf sports at all levels, training and development, albeit some disappointment in not being able to go to the state titles and have our nipper break up due to Covid-19.

Youth development continues to be part of Pacific's DNA and our ongoing success, and although some challenges in the later part of the year with many events being cancelled, our club continued to support and grow our youth with members attending Leadership excellent programmes, and being involve in a range of club activities. A big thank you to Chloe Schofield for taking On this challenging roll over the last 2 seasons.

Our results in surf sports continue to go from strength to strength thanks to our Surf Sports Officer Michelle Slattery and club Coach Richard Hancock, which seen the club again have a record number of members attend training producing results way above its weight at both a nipper and senior level. The club competed and medalled at all levels at branch, and the state lifesaving championships. Again, due to the Covid-19. We were set to compete at senior/ master state and nationals' titles – but were cancelled. Pacific again successfully hosted the u8-10 team carnival for the 4th season and is now a regular feature on the branch calendar. The highlight without doubt was

Grace King in achieving a bronze medal at the state lifesaving championships in the u/14 champion life saver event at the Sunshine Coast.

To our officer manager Gabrielle Kinneally and Kerrie Barnes and her team at Point Danger Branch a big thank you for their continued support and Guidance through the season.

As I mention at the end of every season, our challenge as a club is to keep on delivering and ensure that we have the resources and foresight to keep on exceeding member and community expectations. Pacific no doubt has a very exciting future.

Pacific SLSC reports an operating profit of \$60,413 before depreciation expenses of \$62,304, resulting in a net loss of \$1,891 (2019: (\$66,585)) for the 2019-2020 season. A positive outcome given the effects of Covid-19 across in Australia and the globe from March 2020 onwards. Pacific's position is the result of State and Council funding remaining consistent, increased donations from Pacific Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club with almost a full year of trade with an employed Venue Manager, recognising the Gambling Community Benefit Fund grant for the member's area renovation and obtaining sponsorship for the club's new tractor from Bendigo Bank – Tugun Community Bank Branch.

The club achieved the following achievements that included a mix of building improvements and essential lifesaving equipment;

At present the temporary bar (that lasted 10 years) in the function room is being replaced with a modern bar to ensure compliance with regulations, provide efficiencies and enhance the desirability of the idyllic location. The project has been made possible by a team of dictated club member's sourcing materials and equipment at cost and volunteering their professional trade skills. The welcome addition will open when Covid-19 restrictions are lifted in mid-July.

The club partnered with Tomra Recycling Centre, Varsity Lakes as a Local Donation Partner for February to August 2020. Members and public have the opportunity to donate funds from recyclables through their reverse vending systems to the club. We aim to raise funds for 10 rescue tubs.

The club has been successful in securing the following grants for the upcoming season;

- Round 1 Active Clubs (Activate! Queensland 2019-2029) \$2,200 – 2 x Certificate IVs in Training & Assessment to upskill our trainers.
- Volunteers Grants 2019-2020 (Department of Social Services - Karen Andrews MP's Office) \$3,434 – bank of 18 lockers for patrolling members.

Both projects are will commence in the off season ready for 2020-2021. The finance committee will continue to pursue grants for large equipment purchases and building improvements to provide updated facilities for members. Suggestions for other grants items are welcome for consideration.

The audited financial report is enclosed for review.

Season 2019/20 saw the beginnings of the Proud Pacific Trainers (PPT) concept. This is intended to build on Pacific's long held tradition of high quality lifesaving training, both formal and informal, and ensure we maintain our levels of surf lifesaving excellence for our members, our community and the public we serve. It is an initiative of high visibility of trainers with new training apparel, encouragement of members to assist with training, mentoring of members to improve skills and knowledge, and continued modernisation of our training delivery methods.

With enormous drive from Rebecca Farley at the end of last season, Pacific obtained a grant for training equipment that enabled us to update the training equipment and facilities. This equipment was all put into use this season for the first time. It included new tables and chairs for the training room, additional training defibrillators, some dedicated training equipment that previously would be borrowed from the patrol arena (not during patrol hours, of course), new electronic inners for much of our CPR mannequin fleet and a laptop and iPad to connect them to for interactive learning and fun.

The training started early with a combined Pacific / Tallebudgera IRB course after the end of last season that saw a number of our younger and older members achieve (or re-achieve) their IRB crew and driver qualifications. Many thanks to Tallebudgera for inviting us to be involved in what was a great event that highlighted the high levels of cooperation and friendship between our clubs. Concurrently to this, a Pacific Winter Bronze squad was run in mostly perfect Qld Winter conditions. Some chilly and determined people qualified very early in the 19/20 season. In the September school holidays, Pacific again hosted an SRC Camp followed closely by an intensive Bronze Camp. It was great to see the teamwork and camaraderie that develops during these camps as well as the skills and knowledge to achieve their rescue qualifications. A Bronze / SRC course was held from October to December and various emergency care courses and short courses run by the club, branch and SLSQ were attended by members throughout the season.

In total, 178 new senior awards were achieved by Pacific members this season. That is a great achievement, particularly as our training season and plans were cut short by the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Congratulations to all the members that achieved their new found skills and knowledge! I'd like to thank all the trainers that helped out this season: Jeff, Andrew, Denis, Tonya, Rachael, Ken, Kev and in particular Anne Turner, who finally achieved her formal trainer qualification! Anne's help was again invaluable and she always trains with enthusiasm and a smile. I also would like to thank the water safety, without whom we can't get in the water: Jess, Michelle, Shaun, Taylah, Jacqui, Helen, Troy, Hamish, Paul and a few others that were always willing to help out at short notice. Proficiencies (skills maintenance) were held monthly throughout the first half of the season. Pacific members were deemed proficient in over 700 awards, thus allowing us to maintain our currency and high level of lifesaving excellence!

Congratulations to Kenneth Clark for 35 Year Assessing and Jeffrey Deegan for 20 Year Assessing Service .

Thank you once again to our trainers, assessors, water safety members and support personnel who assisted with each and every course held this season. I encourage any members who would like to join the Proud Pacific Trainers team to get involved and feel the satisfaction of sharing your skills and experience with others.

- Continuance of "word-of-mouth" feedback from clients and visitors indicating that they are very pleased with their whole Pacific Beach Function Centre experience.

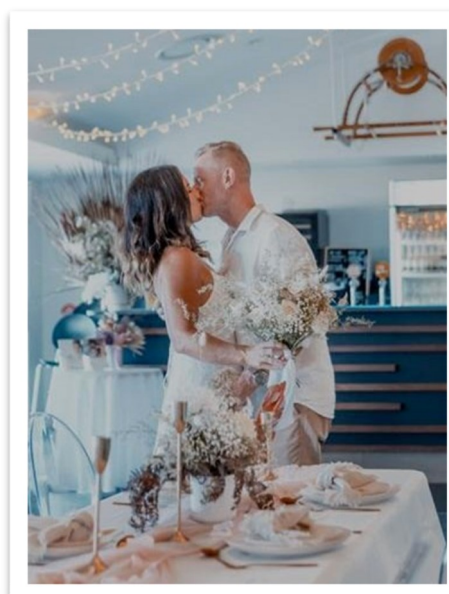

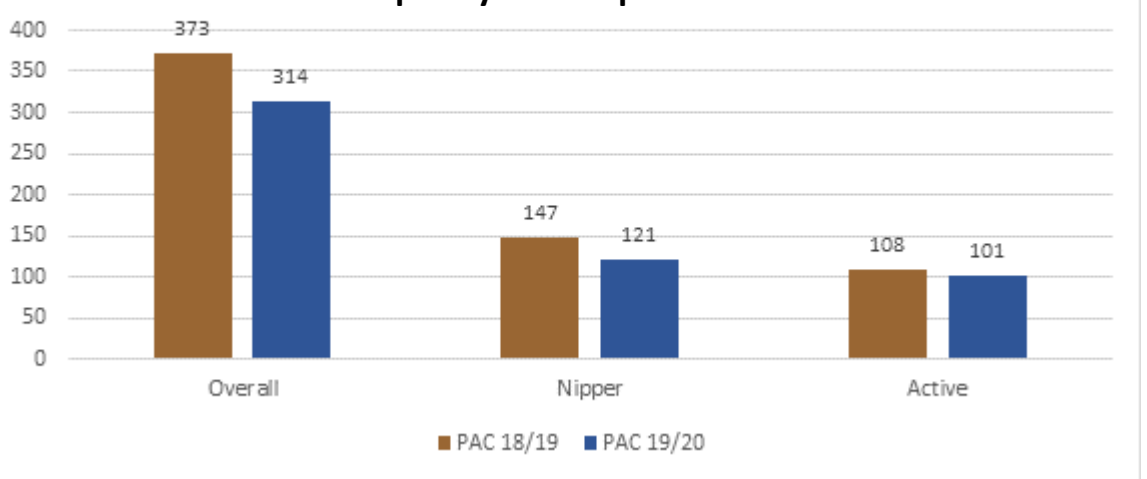

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Financial Reporting Framework

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (Queensland)*, *Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013*, and the entity's Constitution. The board of management has determined that the entity is not a reporting entity.

Statement of Compliance

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with *Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (Queensland)*, *Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013*, the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101: *Preparation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107: *Cash Flow Statements*, AASB 108: *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors*, AASB 1031: *Materiality* and AASB 1054: *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

b. **Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

c. **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

d. **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (cont'd)

e. **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

f. **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

g. **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the entity during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a currently liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.


Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report

As part of an audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional scepticism throughout the audit. We also:

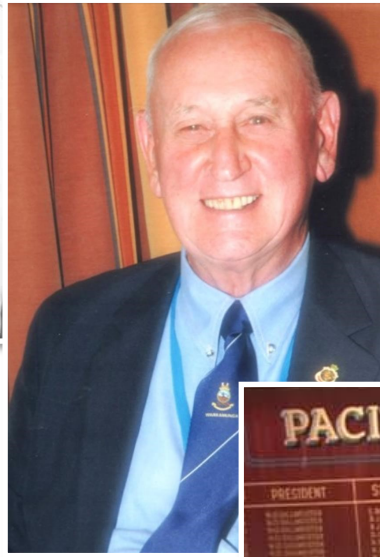
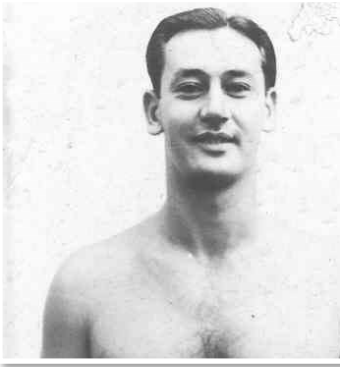
