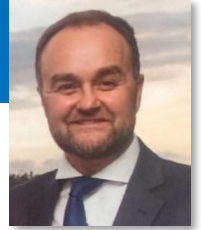

2020/21 marks the 74th Season Pacific SLSC has been patrolling northern Palm Beach, and I am pleased to say that we have continued our mission of no lives lost between the flags, continued growth, whilst maintaining the club's family-oriented values and culture.

Pacific's proud record of member recognition continued with Tim Hart, Taylah Slattery and Chloe Maxwell all receiving the McPherson Award for their dedication and commitment to the community; and Jared Clark being recognised at the Point Danger Branch Awards as Life Saver of the Year. At the Annual General Meeting, the club recognised both Rachael Clark and Clayton Webster as Life Members of the Club, two truly great members who have contributed to Pacific over many years.

I am so very proud of our management team that continues to deliver on the goals that are based on the club's five year strategic plan, focusing on connecting with our members and community, sustainable growth, governance, and maximising the recognition of our club and member achievements, to deliver good outcomes in all facets of surf life saving. This season the Supporters Club opened Café Twelve 91, it will be a valuable source of revenue for years to come; as well securing many grants for vital equipment and member services.

Through the fantastic leadership of our Club Captain Shaun Slattery in his 5th season in this role and Chief Training Officer Anthony Folliot in his 3rd, the club continues to set the high standards with beach patrols and the level of skill needed to maintain proficiency, which is highly regarded throughout the surf life saving fraternity. This season we saw 46,000 people visit our beach and we completed 4,651 beach patrol hours, 348 Operations Support hours, 12 rescues, 409 preventative actions with numerous members gaining patrol awards. This season saw two of our members, Michelle Slattery and Regan Hickey recognised by the Mayor of the Gold Coast for their involvement in a mass rescue and resuscitation at Tallebudgera Beach on Australia Day. This rescue has been recognised by the Commonwealth of Australia at Parliament House, Canberra where Michelle Slattery accepted on behalf of the club a National Rescue Medal.

Pacific's financial position continues to be solid and is attributed to not only good fiscal management led by our Treasurer Rebecca Farley, but also our partners through sponsorship and donations and members rolling up their sleeves for various fundraising activities and the sourcing of grants. This season the club through the donations and grants secured over \$70,000 which has been invested back into rescue equipment, building renovations, and our training room. The Pacific Board and its members are extremely grateful to all levels of Government and individuals that have contributed in some way.

Our Nipper programme saw a change of the guard with Matt Lunn stepping up as the Junior Activity Chairperson this season. This programme continues to provide a valuable impetus in creating an environment that continues to increase the number of young life savers coming through this valuable programme. Matt and his team saw a growth in numbers from 121 to 125, along with another successful year in Nipper Surf Sports at all levels, training and development, and more Nipper parents putting up their hand to make the programme very inclusive.

Youth development continues to be part of Pacific's DNA and our ongoing success. This season Taylah Slattery took the reins with some new ideas and energy which saw Pacific participate at every major Surf Life Saving youth event including mentors and leaders, and Beau Hickey being named Youth of the Month for March.

Our results in Surf Sports continue to go from strength to strength thanks to our Surf Sports Officer Michelle Slattery and Club Coach Richard Hancock, which saw the club again have a record number of members attend training, producing results way above our weight at both a nipper and senior level. The club competed and medalled at all levels at Branch, State Championships, as well as some fantastic results at the National Titles. Pacific again successfully hosted the Point Danger Branch Under 8-10 Team Carnival for the 5th season and is now a regular feature on the Branch calendar. The highlight without doubt was Robert Pade and Gavin Jordan placing

first in the Masters Double Ski event and Robert Pade placing second in the Masters Single Ski at the State Championships.

To our Office Manager Gabrielle Kinneally and Rachael Clark and her team at Point Danger Branch a big thank you for their continued support and guidance through the season. It is certainly appreciated and vital to Pacific's continued success.

As I mention at the end of every season – our challenge as a club is to keep on delivering and ensure that we have the resources and foresight to keep on exceeding member and community expectations. Pacific no doubt has a very exciting future with the growth we are currently experiencing in the northern Palm Beach area.

As President I am very confident that we have a great Board and membership that has a willingness to maintain our growth and success whilst still maintaining our family values, culture and a club that promotes something for everyone.

It has again been an honour and pleasure to serve as President over Pacific for my 6th year and the 2020/21 Season.

Well it's been another busy year at Pacific and on behalf of the Board of Management, I am pleased to present the 74th Annual Report for the 2020-21 season. Members of the Board of Management, as in previous years have once again fulfilled their obligations for the management of Pacific not only as a part of the Surf Life Saving organisation but as an Incorporated Association.

Next season, 2021—2022 will be our 75th patrolling season with the first meeting of the club being held by our foundation members on the 26th April 1947. The challenges of a surf club have always existed but in our foundation year even finding a name for our new surf club had its problems. Many suggestions were put forward such as 'Pacific', 'North Palm Beach' and 'Elanora' which was the correct postal name of the Palm Beach area at the time. Pacific was chosen because most of the foundation members were returned servicemen who had served in the Pacific area and our club colours of blue, gold and brown represent the sea, sun and sand of the Pacific area.

The problems of last season were of course different but they were overcome as were our early ones. In addition to the normal activities of the Secretary involved in the running of the club, significant work was put into the compliance matters for the establishment of the Café which will provide a solid revenue stream into the future. It was necessary to obtain the required City of Gold Coast approvals for the development application, canteen food licence, building certification, trade waste disposal and signage. Installing the new sign at the front of the club and the other club signage required us to meet advertising and display conditions even before we could put them up. A big thank you to Troy Fenech, Dave Fisher and Pete at Devocoean Dive who did all the welding.

Thank you to State Member for Burleigh Michael Hart MP and City of Gold Coast Division 13 Councillor Daphne McDonald for their support with the café and together with our Federal Member for McPherson Hon Karen Andrews MP, their collective support for the club. All are strong supporters and friends of Pacific.

Pacific SLSC reports an operating profit of \$39,246 before depreciation expenses of \$63,316, resulting in a net loss of \$24,070 (2020: (\$1,891)) for the 2020-2021 season. It has been a financially challenging season for many reasons.

The Building Committee undertook the bar renovation during Covid-19 lock down, looks great and timed well as no events were affected; loan repayments commenced November 2020.

A Development Approval (DA) was pursued for the kiosk area, to enable commercial operations to commence; approval received late December 2020. Donations from Pacific Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club were almost halved when compared to the prior year. This was a direct result of Covid-19 as minimal functions could be held in Pacific Beach Function Centre for the period April to mid August 2020. Donations to the surf club ceased during this period however the function centre is now heavily booked going forward.

Supporters also opened Café Twelve 91 in late December 2020 following the DA approval to capitalise developments and population growth in the area. It has taken three months to build a strong client base and start making a profit. The menu, hours and profits for the café will continue to evolve as the client base continues to grow. Pacific's future is looking positive.

The club achieved the following that include a mix of building improvements and essential lifesaving equipment:

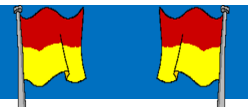

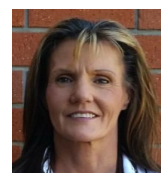
There is also a new IRB that has been ordered and due to be delivered by December along with some rescue boards.

Season 2020/21 saw the return of life saving to some normality after the Covid-19 lockdowns and cancelled training due to imposed restrictions. Our Proud Pacific Trainers (PPT), worked hard with new technologies and online learning delivery models introduced by SLSA. With the new modalities and variations to the delivery of training due to Covid still in place, this season was one of re-grouping and commencing a path back to normality. Next season will be an even better opportunity for the encouragement of members to assist with training and mentoring to improve skills and knowledge across the club, and for continued improvement of our training delivery methods via the new technologies.

The planned winter training leading up to the start of the 20/21 season did not progress, so the first training sessions for the season were the SRC Camp and Bronze Camp that were held during the September school holidays. The teamwork and camaraderie that develops during these camps as well as the skills and knowledge developed by the participants to achieve their rescue qualifications is amazing to be a part of. A Bronze / SRC course was held from October to January, with some treacherous conditions encountered along the way and some amazing drive and courage shown by the participants. Various emergency care courses and short courses were run by the club, branch and SLSQ that were attended by members throughout the season. The season's training programme concluded with a joint IRB course held in conjunction with Tallebudgera, Rainbow Bay and Mermaid Beach. It's great to see the clubs working together to help our whole organisation prosper.

In total, 104 new awards were achieved by Pacific members this season. That is a great achievement, particularly as our training plans were affected by the general craziness of the 2020 world! Congratulations to all the members that achieved their new found skills and knowledge!

I'd like to thank all the trainers that helped out this season: Jeff, Andrew, Tonya, Rachael, Ken and in especially Anne Turner, who's help was again invaluable and she always trains with enthusiasm and a smile. I also would like to thank the water safety, without whom we can't get in the water: Jess, Michelle, Shaun, Taylah, Jacqui, Helen, Troy, Hamish, Paul and a few others that were always willing to help out at short notice. It was a great team effort from all at the club.

We welcomed some new members who have also become our neighbours at Magnoli. Welcome to the Pacific community! Hopefully we can encourage a few more to join and train up to keep our idyllic beach safe.

Proficiencies (skills maintenance) were held monthly throughout the first half of the season. Pacific members were deemed proficient in 393 awards, thus allowing us to maintain our currency and high level of lifesaving excellence!

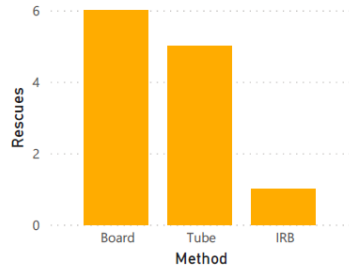

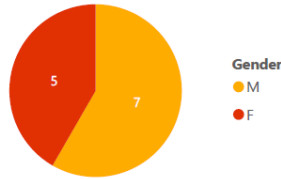

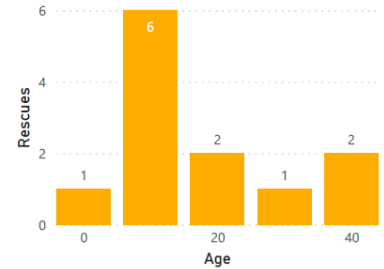
Rescues by Method



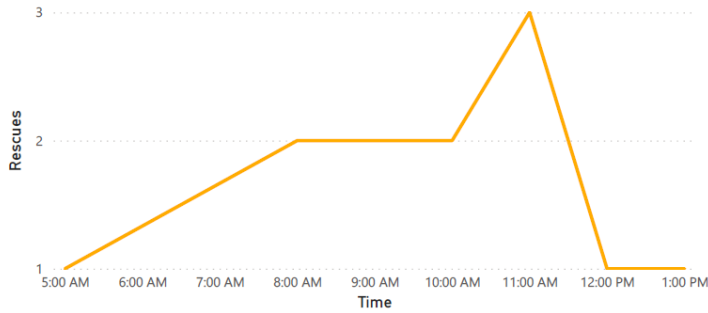
Rescues by Gender



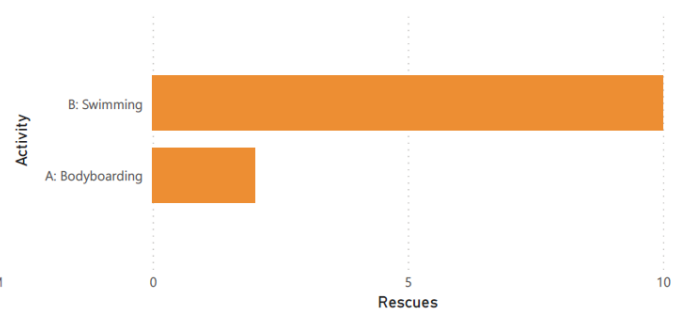
Rescues by Age



Rescues by Time

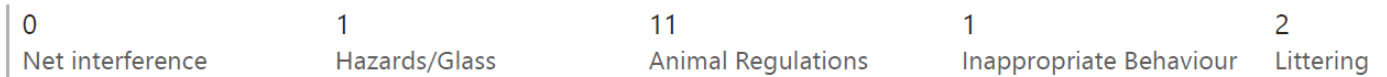

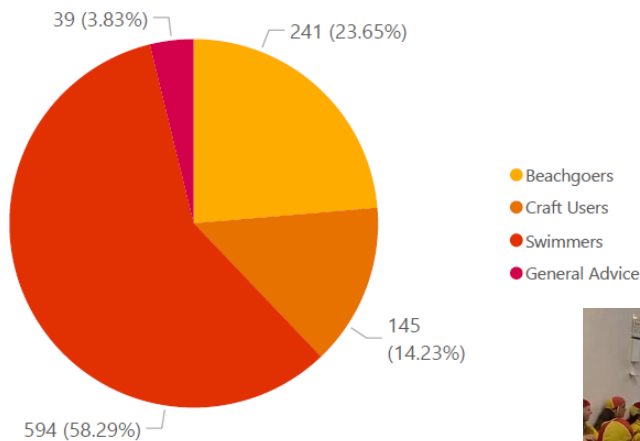

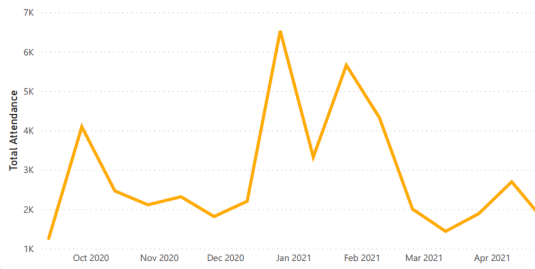

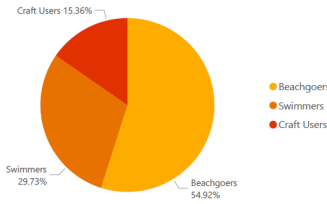

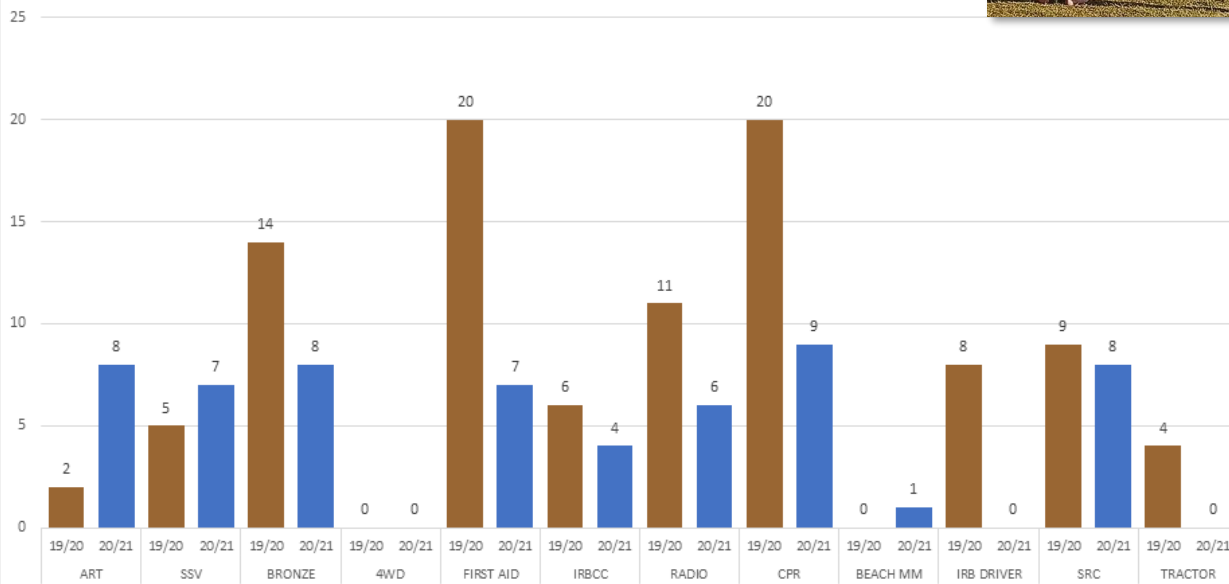
Visitor Distribution



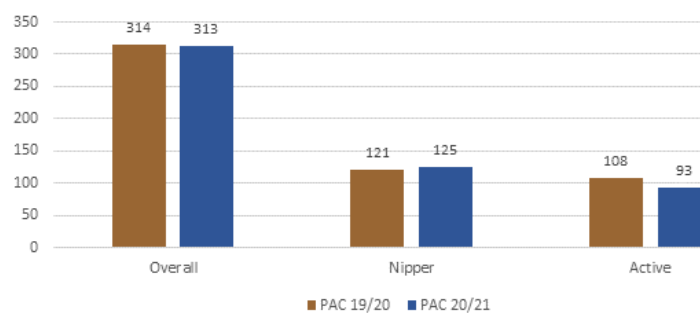

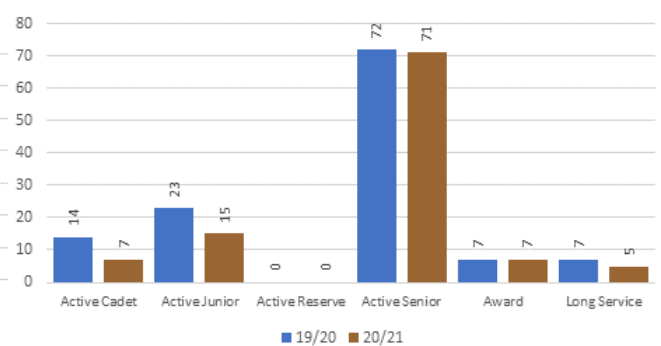
Pacific - 2 year award comparison



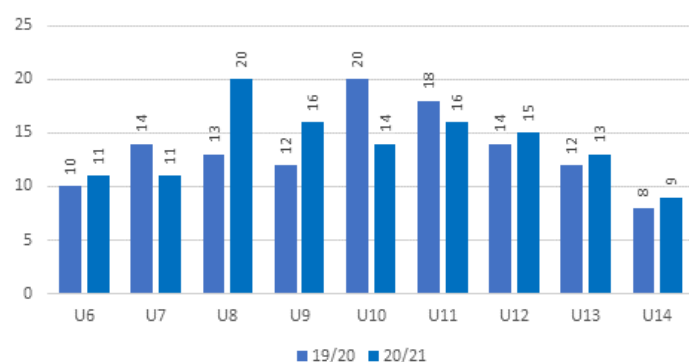
Pacific Membership Stats 2 year Comparison



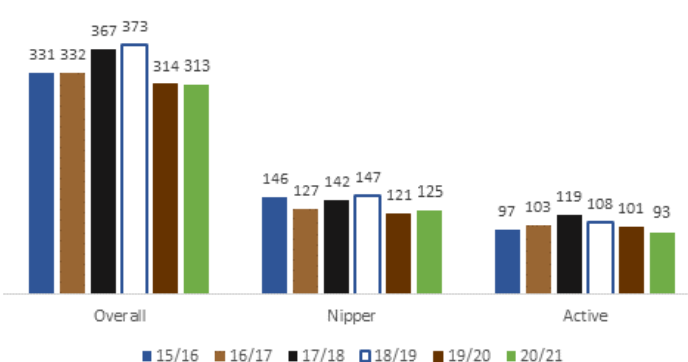

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Financial Reporting Framework

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, the *Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (Queensland)* and the entity's Constitution. The Entity is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise

Statement of Compliance

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101: *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107: *Cash Flow Statements*, AASB 108: *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors*, AASB 1031: *Materiality* and AASB 1054: *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The entity has concluded that the requirements set out in AASB 10 and AASB 128 are not applicable as the initial assessment on its interests in other entities indicated that it does not have any subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures. Hence, the financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. **Income Tax**

This entity is exempt from income tax under the provisions of the *Income Tax Assessment Act*.

b. **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either of the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are as follows:

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

d. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

e. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

f. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the ATO. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

g. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest Income

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method.

h. Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the entity during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a currently liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.



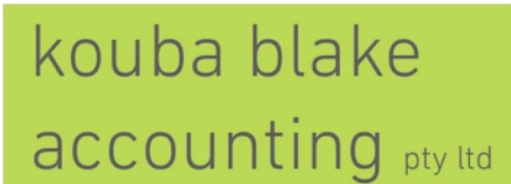
