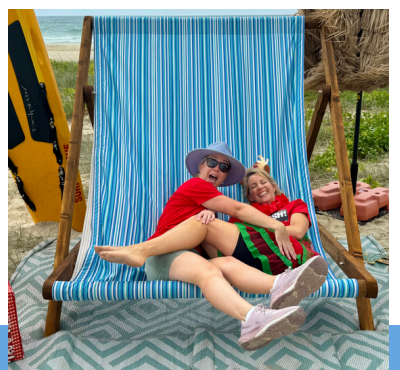
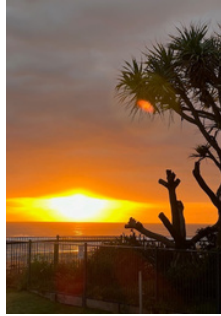
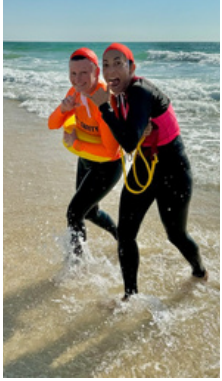

Dear Members,

It is with great pride and gratitude that I present the annual report for Pacific SLSC.

This year has been one of remarkable growth, resilience, and community spirit, which are the hallmarks of what makes our club so unique.

As our club continues to grow and changes, it gives me great joy and enthusiasm to witness the continued camaraderie and strength in our club, continuing our ethos of a family friendly club. This season has seen some interesting challenges, including weather events and the advent of the development site next door.

Thank you to all our members for your understanding and patience as we have navigated the best possible outcome for our club, maintaining a friendly and prosperous relationship we deem fit for a successful relationship with the management team next door.

Our new season celebrations kicked off early, a team of Pacific members attending the 100-year anniversary celebration of our Branch. 100 years of patrolling the Point Danger Branch area is a significant achievement, gained by the commitment of a well-established organisation with the common goal of keeping our beaches safe.

Patrolling:

I commend our dedicated patrolling members, who have successfully managed our beach that has delivered some challenging conditions this season, however, with no loss of life. A mention must go to patrol group 4, this patrol group, captained by Jeff Deagan held 3 separate rescues and with a high level of professional care and service. All Patrol Group 4 cadets proved themselves to be competent and mature, ensuring the future of our patrol members to be strong and vigilant.

All Club Members can be very proud of the strength skill in our patrol groups and the level of commitment for our local community of beach goers. As our statistics show, the increasing number of visitors to our beach has been significant, causing more demand for our patrol supervision. We have all felt the increasing population in Palm Beach, while our patrol members continue to rise to the occasion.

As our Club Captain steps down this season, I would like to thank Paul Mowbray for his leadership and unwavering commitment. Paul has led by example, in and out of the water, with integrity, enthusiasm and heart. Paul has been a pleasure to work with and has been a fabulous Club Captain.

Coaching and Carnivals:

Our club coach, Richard Hancock, has once again delivered the club with athletes ready and hungry for competition. Richard's guidance and passion for the sport have made a lasting impact on our training group, helping our youth development not only as lifesavers but as individuals. We are grateful for Richards leadership and commitment to our young athletes.

It was very unfortunate this season to see so many events cancelled due to weather events, but the hard work and determination of our training group represent the values Surf Lifesaving stands for. This season Branch Championships were cancelled for our Master competitors, and State Championships cancelled for both our youth and Masters' competitors. Cyclone Alfred certainly took a toll on our season and our beaches. I can confirm, however, the artificial reef did a tremendous job protecting our beach at Pacific. It has protected our beach from the huge amount of scarping suffered at so many beaches along the coast. As our athletes headed to the Australian Championships, they were keen to preform and test their abilities.

This season we were fortunate to have the Surf Life Saving World Titles on the Gold Coast. This gave some of our athletes the opportunity and experience to compete on an international stage. Exposure to this the level of organised competition, seeing the wide variety of competitors and how they prepare and compete is a very valuable lesson for our young members. It's often said that competing physically relies a great deal of mental acuity, awareness and readiness, and exposure to such events gives young aspiring athletes a more pronounced focus and allows them to mature as athletes and not be overawed by the intensity of such an event.

Once again, this season, both our youth and master athletes performed well. Our strong team of masters shone, bringing home Australian Championship medals. Congratulations to all our athletes for representing our club with pride.

Nippers:

Our nipper program continues to thrive, welcoming many new young lifesavers who bring energy and enthusiasm to our beach every weekend. These future leaders are the heart of our club, and it is inspiring to see their skills and confidence grow each season.

A heartfelt thank you to all the incredible team of helpers, working behind the scenes for our Surf Club. Your unseen effort and dedication make all the difference. Your commitment empowers our youth to thrive, grow, and chase their dreams. To our Age managers, Officials, Water Safety Officer and Water Safety providers, BBQ and merchandise providers, you are the backbone of our club. You all do a wonderful job, and we are incredibly grateful for all you do, thank you!

Board and Committees:

Once again, our board and committee members have performed their duties for the best possible outcomes for our club. Thank you all for your support and the continued success of our club. The importance of a unified "one club" attitude is of utmost importance to our board members. Together we are stronger, together we are better.

Our skilled club secretary Jason Rose has successfully updated and delivered our new Website. The new website will include information to assist our new and current members with the tools they need to update memberships, enroll in courses and keep up to date with current items.

Club Finance and Sponsors:

Special thanks to Gavin Jordon and Gordon Grant for demolishing the wall and assisting with the project, including the purchase of steel beam.
- Marquee have supplied and laid concrete for the club in several areas including the extension to the length of the café awning area, the extension of concrete in the outdoor shower area and the concrete pad outside the members door area.
- They have assisted our Club House Director with numerous plumbing repairs, floor repairs and the purchase and installation of the mirror in our car park.
- They have provided various pieces of hardware and assistance when heavy lifting has been required for different projects.

It was another idyllic and fun season at Pacific Surf Lifesaving Club and even Cyclone Alfred made little impact on our amazing stretch of beach or the club house.

As club secretary I observed a strong uplift in overall governance and compliance during the season, initiated by Surf Lifesaving Queensland. Focus areas included potential conflicts of interest, Blue Card status for patrolling members, and thoroughness and transparency around meeting minutes, actions and motions of approval.

The Board was able to meet every second Tuesday per month for 2-3 hours. Given the voluntary nature of this responsibility, the commitment and contributions of the Board was both appreciated and essential to the overall operation of the club. On top of discussions and decisions made through long-standing topics as well as regular Board reports, the Board was able to deliver over 60 actions covering a range of areas such as club facilities improvements, policy updates, funding for Nippers activities and improving overall communication in the club.

With SLSQ providing facilitation over several weekends, the Board also put together an updated 2025-2030 Strategic Plan based on member commentary and observations made throughout the year, to be further socialized and presented at the upcoming AGM. The main emphasis was around growing our patrolling member base to cater to the growing population on our beach, and ensuring that Surf Lifesaving excellence underpinned by the “pillars” of Nippers and Surf Sports areas remains our critical focus.

From a practical perspective there many areas of infrastructure that were delivered ranging from; café working conditions and payment reliability, better WiFi coverage, outdoor concreting, essential structural repairs, a new public website (<https://pacificslsc.au>), enhanced Surf Sports site (StackApp) and a new patrol arena and IRB motor.

However, all these activities and results were only possible with the sum of all contributions and efforts by our club members. When I see the amount of volunteer hours put in by patrolling members, the incredible amount of training and dedication of our competitors and the Surf Sports management, the endless task list of Junior Activities and everyone working with Nippers, the hours given to Water Safety and BBQ running and the often overlooked time and effort by members all stepping up to do their bit... I am truly amazed by the quality and extent of effort that has gone into maintaining Pacific SLSC as one of the best clubs in the Gold Coast.

Heading in to each new financial year, Anne and I sit down and prepare a cashflow forecast for the year ahead. In the past it has been relatively easy, as we knew we could rely quite heavily on regular donations from the Supporters club. The year just gone was not quite so easy. With the construction site next door and rising interest rates, function bookings were not as regular and as such we had to budget with that in mind. To the credit of the Supporters club, their donations, while down on the previous years, were not down as much as feared. This, combined with increased sponsorship, helped us to finish the year with our total bank balances slightly higher than we started the year. Moving forward, we are expecting the same unstable conditions to continue, so the board will need to keep working together to navigate this.

This year has seen many significant improvements for patrolling members, with the finalisation and delivery of both the new SSV and the new patrol arena. I have heard positive things about both purchases and do hope that the cushions purchased for the arena are making patrolling a little more comfortable. A new IRB has been paid for and is expected to arrive in time for the new patrolling season. There was also a new hot water system installed. The Café has seen the new awning finished which is making it nicer for customers and we have installed an air conditioner in the Café to help make the summer a bit more bearable for the staff.

Our Life Members got together in January this year to hold a barbecue at Bunnings. This was a highly successful event with around \$3,100 raised for the club. Our JAC has also been busy, arranging sponsorships from both Classic Concrete Pumping and The Pines Dental Surgery. We also have Harvie Dental back on board as a sponsor, and Winslow's continued sponsorship is truly appreciated. Our new neighbours, Marquee Projects Pty Ltd were also very generous with a \$20,000 sponsorship package.

As the season for 2024/25 draws to a close, one finds himself reflecting on the season that has been. And it has been another great season. As the flags come down on Pacific Beach, we as a club have completed 5220.5 hours. We had 94 Patrolling members that contributed to this total. Well done to all.

A special thanks to all that gave up their time to help patrol our beach. This year's Top 10 Patrolling members - each patrolling over 91.25 hours - are: Jason Rose, Hamish Folliott, Anthony Folliott, Maria McRae, Mark Kennedy, Tammy Fenech, Jeff Deegan, Lachlan Macrae and Bronte Fenech. Thank you for going above and beyond!

Thanks also to all the PC's and VC's. This year we were able to get back to 9 patrolling groups on the roster. Thank you, Troy Fenech (1), Ed Bowers (2), Hamish Folliott (3), Jeff Deegan (4), Anthony Folliott (5), Tim Hart (6), Andrew McNeilly (7) and Jason Rose (9) for doing what you do. Thanks to our IRB Captain, Jason Rose; again, your contribution in this area has been second to none, making sure that our IRB equipment is fully functional and ready to go.

In terms of patrol stats, we had 64,640 visitations to our beach, which is a 12,082 increase on last year. Pre-covid Pacific used to have around 20 to 25 thousand visitors. This is a massive 3-fold increase in the span of some 5 years. This is a reflection on the population increase within our area. Palm Beach has been awakened....

With more people, we have more issues to deal with. With the following statistics I have left last year's stats in brackets for comparison. 75 (28) First Aid treatments, 1312 (991) preventative actions and 5(8) rescues. WOW.... well done all. The best stat of all is that not a single life was lost on our beach while we, as Club Pacific diligently patrolled our beach. As a result of this, 5 people were able to go home to loved ones and continue to participate in this thing called life. We as a club should be immensely proud of these statistics.

A few patrols this season have been a standout and show our club's commitment and strength. All volunteer patrols this year, X-mas Day, Women's Day, Life-members, and Anzac Day morning saw strong patrol numbers. On X-mas day we had 18 members, Women's Day patrol was unfortunately cancelled due to conditions, 11 at the life members patrol and 10 for the Anzac morning patrol. Thank you all to those that did the extras and jumped in. RESPECT.

This has been a year where we have also seen great advancement in our training and competitive side. I will leave the details to our Surf Sports Officer and CTO, but it is great to see the club come together from patrols, nippers and to the competitors. We are a whole or complete club.

From an operational point of view, we are continuing to fund, source and supply our equipment that takes to the beach. This season we have taken on a new IRB engine and next season will see the club gain a new Thundercat Gen III, which should be ready for Christmas.

I hope you all have a fantastic off-season filled with the things that make one happy. I look forward to seeing you all come back with a bounce in your step, refreshed and ready to take to the beach again with a few stories in tow. Wishing you all a happy and safe off-season.

CHIEF TRAINING OFFICER



Season 2024/25 kicked off in June with some amazing people enthusiastically enjoying the Gold Coast winter sunshine (and a few cold days too!) with our Bronze & SRC Winter training course. This year we had a number of new members and nipper parents who challenged themselves to achieve new skills and knowledge that led to passing their Bronze Medallions and Surf Rescue Certificates with flying colours.

The now embedded Learning Management System (aXcelerate) still challenges our Proud Pacific Trainers (PPT) but we worked through it and discovered a few workarounds for some of the nuances it contains. Further updates to the national training curriculum for this season saw some upskilling requirements for our trainers as we keep up with the advances adopted by SLSQ from the ANZ Resuscitation Council.

Pacific is still looking to build and grow the PPT team to continue to deliver and grow the high quality of skills and knowledge across our club. SLSQ has introduced new pathways to help facilitate members gaining their Trainers, Assessors and Cert IV TAE, which has now been updated with a new national curriculum. This season we have a number of new members undertaking their Trainers qualification, which is fantastic to see. I wish Hamish, Jason and Julianne well as they embark on their lifesaving training journey.

The October Bronze course saw some more new members and nipper parents and had an international presence as well as our most senior Bronze trainee at 79 years of age (an inspiration to us all!)

This season, Pacific has trained thirteen new Bronze holders Surf Rescue Certificate holders to help boost the patrolling numbers on the beach. We also had a number of members that did the Flood Awareness course to be able to assist with the Cyclone Alfred emergency situation and related flood emergencies.

Pacific had strong attendance at various emergency care courses, IRB and non-accredited courses that were run by the club, branch and SLSQ. A number of people gained their First Aid, ART, Patrol Captain and IRB qualifications. Some of these were recent Bronze recipients, so their thirst for knowledge and skill improvement is to be commended. This shows how Pacific members are keen to continue to learn, grow and improve the service that we provide to our local community. Congratulations to all the members that achieved their newly found skills and knowledge! Many of Pacific's training courses were also patronised by members of other clubs, which is a testament to the respect held by others, across the region, for the quality of our training programs.

Thanks to all the trainers that helped out this season: Jeff, Ken, Lav and Anne, whose help is invaluable. Thank you also to those members who supported our training programs by participating in water safety and by acting as patients, without whom we can't get in the water: Hamish, Maddie, Matilda, Bronte, Ziva, Ruby, Julianne and a few others that were always willing to help out at short notice. It was a great team effort from all at the club!

Proficiencies (Skills Maintenance) were held monthly throughout the first half of the season. 110 Pacific members were deemed proficient in 445 awards and accreditations, thus allowing us to maintain our currency and high level of lifesaving excellence! A big thank you to Ken Clark who always makes time to help the members through the skills maintenance process, with all of us learning from him along the way.

On behalf of the Pacific Management Team I offer my congratulations to all members who gained new awards this past season. Greatness can be best achieved by challenging yourself and I encourage everyone to have a go, challenge yourself and strive for the next level of excellence! Thank you once again to our trainers, assessors, water safety members and support personnel who assisted with each and every course held this season. The 2024/2025 season has been a truly remarkable and rewarding year for Pacific's Nipper program with 150 Nippers registered by end of season. It has been a season defined by growth, collaboration, and important milestones that reflect the shared dedication of our Age Managers, parents, and broader club community. On behalf of the JAC's, we are honoured to present this summary of accomplishments that we've achieved together.

One of the most significant achievements this season has been the doubling of Age Managers across most groups. This development has not only strengthened the structure of our program but also enriched the quality of mentorship and guidance provided to our nippers. With 3 of our U14's achieving their Surf Rescue Certificates to join the ranks of patrolling members.

The rollout of the digital sign-on system was another big step forward for the club. Embracing new technology is never simple, and while there were some learning curves along the way, we're grateful for the patience and enthusiasm of all involved. This system has streamlined processes and set the foundation for even more efficiencies in the seasons ahead.

To ensure the Nipper sessions run smoothly and with purpose, weekly lesson plans were set down this season, providing structure and clear objectives for each age group. These plans have greatly benefited both Age Managers and nippers, creating consistency in learning and skill development throughout the program.

Communication within the Nipper Age Managers team has also seen improvements. The establishment of an Age Managers group chat and the introduction of structured briefings every Sunday morning have allowed us to share updates, troubleshoot concerns, and ensure everyone is well-prepared for the day ahead. This sense of teamwork and coordination has played a key role in the success of our program.

We couldn't be on the beach each Sunday without our Water Safety Supervisor, Peach, and Water Safety and IRB team. To each volunteer that dons the orange each Sunday to support our children we are eternally grateful.

Planning and organisation were further enhanced through the development of a detailed calendar for the season and a roster system. The roster, covering set-up, pack-down, and BBQ duties, helped distribute responsibilities equitably among families and club members. This allowed everyone to share in the operational aspects of the program while creating opportunities for social connection and team spirit around the BBQ!

Support for our Age Managers was another priority for this season. With the guidance and expertise of mentors Troy and Richard, our Age Managers were provided with hands-on advice and mentoring, helping them build confidence and refine their roles within the program. Their dedication and willingness to lend their experience have been invaluable.

Recognising the importance of roles outside the water, we introduced a dedicated uniform salesperson, ensuring the smooth distribution of club apparel to families throughout the season. Merchandise also received a refresh, thanks to Louise, with a new and exciting range of club items now available. Their creativity and hard work have ensured that our members can proudly represent Pacific SLSC both on and off the beach.

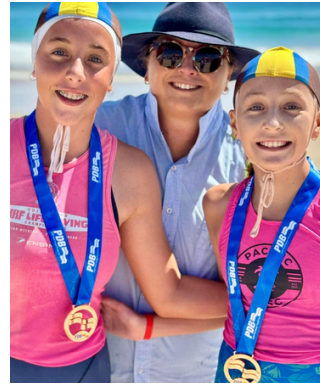

This season the Supporters Committee has concentrated on improving the policies and procedures required to carry us forward into a successful financial future.

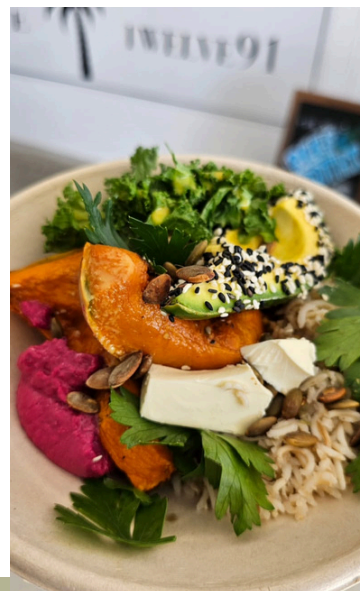

Rescue Method

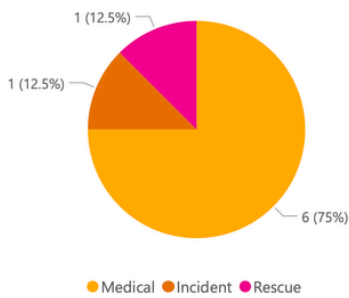

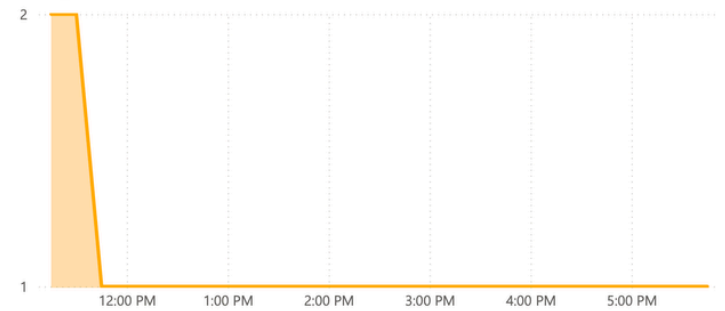

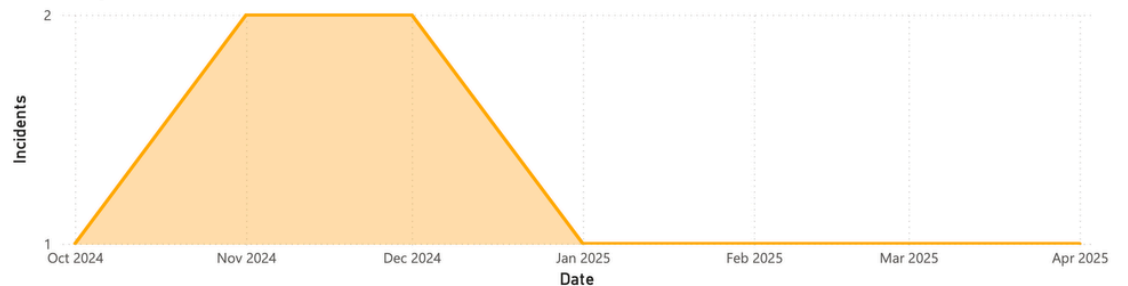

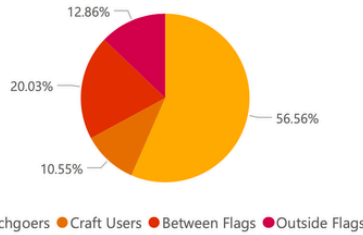

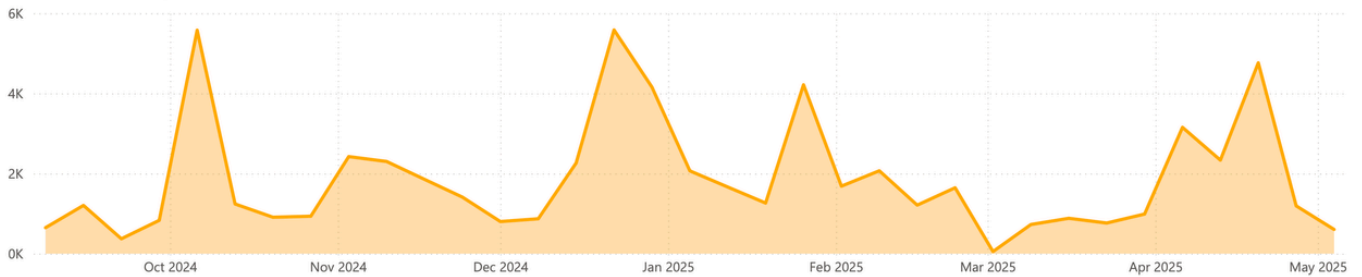

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Financial Reporting Framework

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, the *Associations Incorporations Act 1981 (Queensland)* and the entity's Constitution. The Entity is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise

Statement of Compliance

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101: *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107: *Cash Flow Statements*, AASB 108: *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors*, AASB 1031: *Materiality* and AASB 1054: *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The entity has concluded that the requirements set out in AASB 10 and AASB 128 are not applicable as the initial assessment on its interests in other entities indicated that it does not have any subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures. Hence, the financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. **Income Tax**

This entity is exempt from income tax under the provisions of the *Income Tax Assessment Act*.

b. **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either of the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are as follows:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Clubhouse improvements	5-20%
Gear and equipment	20-33.33%
Fixtures and fittings	10-33.33%
Motor vehicles and trailers	10-25%
Plant and equipment	15-40%

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

d. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

e. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

f. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the ATO. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

g. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest Income

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method.

h. Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the entity during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a currently liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.


